U-NCL-CFC-12 Caring for Children L1 Certificate

- The Caring for Children L1 Certificate course is aimed at parents who want to improve their parenting skills and/or those who want to explore the option of childcare as a career.
- Learners work towards an accredited Level 1 qualification as part of the course and some may be progressing from the L1 Award course
- Engages those from the groups named as Adult and Community priorities that are least likely to participate in learning to provide them with the confidence they need to develop skills in childcare and parenting
- Sessions are delivered in small, friendly and supportive groups that address everyday life issues relating to learners' personal and social skills that prevent them from learning and generally progressing in life to become self-assured, economically and independent individuals.
- Provides a sounds basis knowledge of all aspects related to parenting and childcare
- Provides a good stepping stone as a way of progressing on to an accredited Level 2 qualification

U-NCL-NOC-03 Number Crunch (Ross)

Number Crunch course is an 8 hour course, to be delivered over 2/4 weeks. It aims to engage learners, who are not in work or who are earning a low wage and/or learners who have just completed the Caring for Children L1 and L2 courses, during which they completed units on Healthy Lifestyles. The course builds on the Healthy Lifestyles unit by studying how numeracy skills are used through the process of being active, getting fit and staying healthy.

The course will be delivered in small, friendly and supportive groups and will include a combination of taught sessions and field visits. Learning will take place through group discussions, completion of worksheets, self-assessment, individual target setting, independent research, visits to chosen locations and participation in physical activities. Through the process of getting fit and healthy, learners will develop numeracy skills through calculating (counting, adding and multiplying steps), planning and measuring distance using maps, converting units of measurements, weighing and calculating weight loss, measuring blood pressure and blood pressure, working out time.

All participants will be given a step-counter.
