

# Habitats Regulations Assessment

**Addendum Report for:** 

**Aymestrey Neighbourhood Area** 

**June 2018** 



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### 1.0 Introduction

1.1 To ensure that the requirements of the Habitats Directive and Regulations are met, it is necessary to consider the proposed Main Modifications through the HRA process to the Aymestrey NDP; the NDP was refined by the NDP steering group to reflect feedback from consultation on the Draft Plan and Draft Environmental and Habitat Regulations Assessment (HRA) Reports, refer to Appendix 2.

- 1.2 The purpose of this further HRA Addendum Report is to detail the findings of the screening of proposed changes to policies and consider if they significantly affect the conclusions of the earlier HRA Report (February 2018).
- 1.3 The vast majority of refinements are not considered to significantly affect the conclusions of the earlier HRA report, as they did not involve the introduction of new policies or change the overall aims and objectives of the existing planning policies, despite the addition or amendment of criteria in certain places.

### 2.0 Screening of proposed modifications to the NDP

- 2.1 Regulation 102 of the Habitats Regulations 2010 requires that a Screening Assessment be undertaken, in order to identify the 'likely significant effects' of a NDP. Accordingly, a screening matrix was prepared and this determined the extent to which any of the policies and site allocations in the Aymestrey NDP would be likely to have a significant effect on the River Wye SAC or the Downton Gorge SAC.
- 2.2 The findings of the screening matrix can be found in Appendices 1 and 2 of that report.
- 2.3 The screening matrix took the approach of screening each policy, objective and site allocation individually, which is consistent with current guidance. The results from the HRA reports for the Pre-submission version of the Herefordshire Local Plan (Core Strategy) and the proposed Main Modifications were also taken into consideration.
- 2.4 None of the Aymestrey NDP objectives and policies (February 2018) were concluded to be likely to have a significant effect on the European site. This conclusion is based on assumptions and information contained within the Aymestrey NDP, the proposed Main Modifications to the Herefordshire Local Plan (Core Strategy) and the latest version of the HRA for the Local Plan (Core Strategy), updated in April 2015 in light of the said modifications and published on the Council's website.
- 2.5 In many cases this is because the policies themselves would not result in development, i.e. they related instead to criteria for development. But where policies did lead to development, the policies also included mitigation measures to help support the natural environment including biodiversity, and therefore no significant effect conclusion could be reached. These policies have the potential to mitigate some of the possible adverse effects arising from other policies and site allocations.
- 2.6 It was also concluded that the Aymestrey NDP will unlikely have any in-combination effect with any plans from neighbouring parishes.
- 2.7 Therefore it was concluded that the **Aymestrey NDP will not have a likely significant** effect on the River Wye SAC or the Downton Gorge SAC.
- 2.8 The proposed amendments to the draft NDP included the amendment of twelve policies were following the Draft Plan stage; these changes were necessitated by comments

received during the consultation period. Wording changes were made to AYS1, AYS2 AYEnv2, AYEnv3, AYEnv4, AYMT1, AYT2, AYH3 and AYH4 in light of the consultation comments to add additional clarification on the criteria. Policies AYEnv5, AYEnv7a and AYEnv8 were more significantly amended and had additional criteria added for further clarification and inclusion of key topics such as sustainable travel infrastructure. Objectives xii was also amended and objective xiii was added as an additional objective. The amended objectives xii and xiii and policies AYEnv5, AYEnv7a and AYEnv8 have been rescreened due to the changes post reg 14 consultation.

### 3.0 Summary of main findings

- 3.1 The Submission NDP incorporates suggestions made by consultees during the Regulation 14 Draft Plan consultation, by adding clarity and emphasis throughout the document. There have been some additions to the criteria in some of the policies which are strengthening up the protection of the area, promoting sustainable transport measures and utilising existing development in order to reduce unnecessary development.
- 3.2 One comment was received as part of the consultation to the HRA report and the Aymestrey Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) is unlikely to have significant effect on the River Wye SAC and The Downton Gorge SAC. This conclusion is reached on the basis that the NDP is in line with the Herefordshire Local Plan and the NDP can rely on the policies within to ensure no likely significant effect.
- 3.3 Twelve policies and two objectives have been amended for the Submission NDP following the Regulation 14 Draft Plan consultation.
- 3.4 The revised NDP policies are unlikely to result in significant effects on the European sites, a conclusion of which is based on assumptions and information contained within the Aymestrey NDP, the proposed Main Modifications to the Herefordshire Local Plan (Core Strategy) and the latest version of the HRA for the Local Plan (Core Strategy), updated in April 2015 in light of the modifications. This is published on the Council's website.

### 4.0 Conclusion

- 4.1 With reference to section 3 above, none of the amended policies or the additional criteria and amendments to objectives xii and xiii and policies AYEnv5, AYEnv7a and AYEnv8, which were rescreened, are not considered to affect the findings of the previous HRA report. On the contrary; they strengthen the likelihood of there being no adverse impacts.
- 4.2 Therefore the earlier conclusion that the **Aymestrey NDP will not have a likely significant effect on the River Wye SAC or The Downton Gorge SAC** remains valid.

### 5.0 Next steps

5.1 This Addendum Report will be published alongside both the Submission NDP and earlier HRA Report for consultation. Any changes to the plan that arise from this consultation will be subject to further screening, in order to consider their impact on protected sites.
