Herefordshire Archaeology is Herefordshire Council's county archaeology service. It advises upon the conservation of archaeological and historic sites and landscapes and carries out conservation and investigative field projects.

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Summary:

Herefordshire Archaeology, Herefordshire Council's Archaeology Service, was requested to produce a Heritage Impact Assessment in relation to the proposed allocation of an extension area to Wellington Quarry in the emerging Minerals and Waste Local Plan (MWLP).

The production of an HIA has been recommended by Historic England, who raised a soundness objection at the reg.19 consultation on the publication draft MWLP for the proposed extension. The objection was centred upon concerns over the proximity of a number of non-designated assets. This document describes the known heritage assets within the locality (both designated and undesignated), explores the impact and setting concerns of these sites in relation to the proposed extension and discusses the potential for survival of archaeological features and artefacts within the proposed extension area.

It has been demonstrated that the study area within the Lower Lugg valley contains an extensive and rich archaeological landscape. A considerable corpus of data from over 30 years of archaeological work at the present quarry combined with a detailed resource assessment covering this area, has revealed a complex, multi-period landscape which contains extensive and unique archaeological remains.

There is a strong indication that this archaeology would continue into the proposed quarry extension site, and if this area is selected for mineral extraction, it is anticipated that the existing strategy would be utilised in order to ensure that the archaeology has been properly recorded and preserved by record prior to mineral extraction. This assessment has concluded that there will be a setting impact to St Mary's Church in Marden, and very minimal setting impact to Sutton Walls Hillfort. However, it is possible that any future quarrying may lead to increased flood risk to heritage assets, particularly Leystone bridge downstream of the proposed site.

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1. Introduction

The report has been prepared and is intended to inform, contextualise and assess the significance and potential impact of the proposed extension of Wellington Quarry, Wellington, Herefordshire (SO 51290 247590) to the historic environment.

Herefordshire Archaeology (Herefordshire Council's Archaeology Service) were requested to produce the Heritage Impact Assessment (HAI) in order the heritage assets to properly be considered in the draft Minerals & Waste Local Plan (MWLP) and so that the recommendations can be taken forward prior to final site selection within the adoption process

Historic England, who raised an objection at the reg.19 consultation on the publication draft Minerals and Waste Local Plan, has recommended the production of this HIA. The objection raised concerns in relation to the setting of a number of designated heritage assets and non-designated assets, and noting that the area is rich in Prehistoric, Romano-British and early Medieval non-designated heritage assets, which potentially may be impacted by any further quarrying or indicate there are more unknown in the region.

2. Aims and Objectives

The primary aim of the heritage impact assessment is to provide a professional appraisal of the archaeological potential of the site and its setting. This follows the Government guidance in *NPPF* (2021) by presenting a synthetic account of the available archaeological and historical data and its significance

In accordance with NPPF (2021), the report presents a desk-based evaluation of existing information. It additionally follows the Chartered Institute for Archaeologists (CIfA) Standard definition of a desk-based assessment (CIfA 2012). In brief, it seeks to identify and assess the known and potential archaeological resource within a specified area ('the site'), collating existing written and graphic information and taking full account of the likely character, extent, quantity and worth of that resource in a local, regional and national context. It also aims to define and comment on the likely impact of the proposed development scheme on the surviving archaeological resource.

The Chartered Institute for Archaeologists *Standard* states that the purpose of a desk-based assessment is to inform appropriate responses as regards to archaeology as a material consideration and an assessment of the impact on the historical character of the area. It is intended to contribute to the formulation of an informed and appropriate mitigation strategy.

3. Policy and guidance

This document has been produced with reference to relevant legislation. The National Planning Policy Framework (2021) provides such guidance, with specific reference to the following policy points:

194. In determining applications, local planning authorities should require an applicant to describe the significance of any heritage assets affected, including any contribution made by their setting. The level of detail should be proportionate to the assets' importance and no more than is sufficient to understand the potential impact of the proposal on their significance. As a minimum the relevant historic environment record should have been consulted and the heritage assets assessed using appropriate expertise where necessary. Where a site on which development is proposed includes, or has the potential to include, heritage assets with archaeological interest, local planning authorities should require developers to submit an appropriate desk-based assessment and, where necessary, a field evaluation.

195. Local planning authorities should identify and assess the particular significance of any heritage asset that may be affected by a proposal (including by development affecting the setting of a heritage asset) taking account of the available evidence and any necessary expertise. They should take this into account when considering the impact of a proposal on a heritage asset, to avoid or minimise any conflict between the heritage asset's conservation and any aspect of the proposal.

The NPPF also makes provisions for the protecting significance designated and undesignated heritage assets (200 & 203), utilisation of the Historic Environment Records for the determination of impact (192) and stresses the desirability of the proposed development to make a positive contribution to the local character and distinctiveness (197).

In addition specific guidance documents that are considered relevant to this assessment have been consulted for the production of this report, these have been used to provide guidance and ensure quality in the advice being given.

4. Heritage Impact Assessment Methodology

The methodology for this report is an adaptation of the standards outlined in the Chartered Institute for Archaeologists' Standard Guidance paper (CIfA 2012) and the Historic England guidance documents 'Mineral Extraction and Archaeology' (2020) and 'The Historic Environment and Site Allocations in Local Plans' (2015). Advice on assessing significance of heritage has been adapted from Historic England 'Statements of Heritage Significance' (2019).

The work has involved the consultation of the available documentary evidence, Historic Environment Record data, and including records of previous archaeological events and historical maps based on a 1.5km search from the centre of the site. The Herefordshire Historic Environment Record, hold details of known archaeological and historical sites in the vicinity of the proposal site. Guidance on setting issues has been adapted from Historic England's guidance document 'The Setting of Heritage Assets' (2015) these have been explored utilising a 3D visualisation generated from lidar data (Environment Agency), this model has been supplemented with a site walkover.

In summary, the work has involved:


- Identifying the client's objectives and project specifications,
- Undertaking a Historic Environment Record search from Herefordshire for information on heritage assets and previous work,
- Assembling the cartographic and documentary sources available,
- Assembling the LiDAR data from the Environment Agency for the region and generating a 3D Digital Terrain Model,
- Undertaking a site walkover.

It should be stressed that Historic Environment Record rely strongly on the extent of current knowledge which is usually the product of previous work undertaken which for large parts of the study area has not been the case. For this reason, apparently blank zones should not be automatically regarded as being devoid of remains.

In the report, the factual historical, archaeological, cartographic, visualisations and observed data are provided first. This will be followed by an assessment of the data and then conclusions of the study.

5. The Site Location & Description

Wellington Quarry is located at SO 51290 47590 (NGR), 230m west of the village of Marden and 1km east of the village of Wellington in central Herefordshire (Figure 1). The extension area is situated on the broad floodplain of the River Lugg, occupying a flat area to the west of the current course of the river. The site is transected by the Hereford to Leominster Railway and the large, and the active, Sand and Gravel Quarry of Wellington sits in the centre of the site, with the extension areas surrounding it to the north, south and west (Earth Heritage Trust 2021). The proposed quarry extension would expand the existing quarry and would encompass an area of 80.83ha (Herefordshire Council 2021: (a) 21)



6. Geology & Topography

The site lies at approximately 55m OD within the valley floor between the villages of Marden and Wellington, approximately 7km to the north of Hereford City. The site lies on typical alluvial gley soils of the Hollington Association made up of clay, silt, sand and deep gravels. Sedimentary superficial deposit formed between 11.8 thousand years ago and the present during the Quaternary period. This overlays bedrock of the Raglan Mudstone Formation - Siltstone and mudstone, interbedded. Sedimentary bedrock formed between 423.6 and 419.2 million years ago during the Silurian period. (British Geological Survey data accessed 5/9/21).

There is a long history of commercial gravel extraction in the valley, and large scale quarrying in the valley bottom has been underway since the mid-20th century. Since 1986, archaeological work in mitigation of the quarry at Wellington/Moreton has emphasised the high archaeological and geomorphological value of the flood plain area in particular. This work has revealed the extensive and deeply buried survival of regionally and nationally important alluvial and archaeological deposits within the floodplain.

7. Proposed Scheme

Known mineral resources in Herefordshire are relatively limited in range, primarily consisting of aggregates for use in construction but also a small amount of building stone. Aggregates comprise, sand and gravel; crushed rock (limestone); and secondary or recycled materials gained from quarry and waste operations. Wellington has been subject to the removal of suballuvial gravels and is one of three sand and gravel quarries in Herefordshire and an active quarry at the time of the MWLP.

Herefordshire looks to increase its level of self-sufficiency (not least to reduce the environmental burdens from transport) and to make a reasonable contribution to the Managed Aggregate Supply System. Total provision for sand and gravel over the plan period to 31 December 2041 will be 5 million tonnes. Additional provision shall be made through the five-year reviews, if necessary, to maintain a landbank of at least seven years for sand and gravel at 31 December 2041, based on an annual rate of provision to be determined through the review (Herefordshire Council 2021: (a) 21).

A detailed Archaeological Resource Assessment for the Lower Lugg Valley area as a whole was undertaken by Herefordshire Archaeology in 2006/7 (EH ALSF Stage 1 project for the Historic Environment, Project Number 3336). The assessment involved integrated multi-disciplinary collation and critical analysis of the known and potential archaeological, geological, geomorphological resource of the valley, and evaluated the significance of these assets within a regional and national context. The review process also included a critical analysis of the

archaeological fieldwork methodologies, which have been evolved to address deep burial of archaeological deposits in the Lower Lugg floodplain. In addition, the resource assessment also examined the past and projected future development of gravel quarrying in the valley. The current planning framework (national legislation and guidance, West Midlands Regional Spatial Strategy, and Herefordshire Unitary Development Plan) was evaluated to predict the short to medium term pattern of future mineral extraction in the Lower Lugg Valley. (Bapty 2007).

8. Historical and archaeological background

Wellington is first mentioned as a documentary source in Domesday Book. Here it is described as: "Thorkell White held it, 5 hides which pay tax. In lordship 2 ploughs; previously there were 5 ploughs. 9 villagers, 8 smallholders, a priest, a reeve, a smith and 4 riding men; between them they have 8 ploughs. 11 male and 9 female slaves; 2 mills at 13s. At Droitwich he has 17 measures of salt for 30d. Value before 1066 £8; now £7. There were more ploughs there than there are now." This suggests a substantial and comparatively high status/wealthy settlement. The record of 2 mills reinforces its location in the valley floor, it is assumed that both mills are located somewhere along the Wellington brook. The apparent decline in Plough land may indicate that local environmental conditions had changed making the intensification of arable farming problematic within the floodplain.

The Domesday entry for Marden reads as: "King Edward held it. There were many hides, but only two of them pay tax. The land is divided between many (people). The King has 3 ploughs in lordship; 25 villagers, 5 smallholders, 2 ploughmen, 4 slaves and 4 freedmen; between them they have 21 ploughs. A mill at 20s and 25 sticks of eels; woodland which pays 20s, A fishery without dues; from the salt houses in Droitwich, 9 packloads of salt or 9d, further, 8 servants of the King have 7 ploughs.

William son of Norman holds 3 hides, less 1 virgate of this manor.

Norman Pigman holds ½ a hide of this manor.

Earl William put 1 virgate outside this manor and gave it to a Burgess of Hereford.

Ansketel holds 40 acres, both open land and meadow, which King Edward's reeve leased to a relative of his.

3 riding men held William son of Norman's land; they could not be separated from this manor. 9s comes from the produce of this manor's land.

Before 1066 it paid £9 of blanched pence; now it is assessed at £16."

This entry appears to describe a very important estate owned by the King both before and after the Conquest. The detail of land ownership, tenancy and division suggests that it was not just the land that was important but also the social status of owning land within the estate. The reference to a mill, sticks of eels, a fishery and salt reference the importance of the River Lugg as does the reference to meadow, which may be interpreted as water meadow. The amount of land under arable must have been considerable as one of the 'Customs' recorded in Domesday book for Herefordshire states that: "Within the city wall every whole dwelling paid 71/2d and 4d for the hire of horse and on three days in August reaped at Marden...."

The place name of Wellington is uncertain but may be associated with a personal name making it "estate belonging to Weola". The place name of Marden is better understood and appears to mean "enclosed settlement in the district called Maund" (Copplestone-Crow 1989, 199 and 143).


These two entries indicate relatively dense settlement pattern with large-scale farming and exploitation of watercourses under the control of the King and his entourage. Works at Wellington Quarry recorded the timber remains of two Saxon mills. It is possible that the royal estate, originally, a hundredal or half hunderedal land unit referred to as Maund and apparently centered upon the Iron Age Hill fort of Sutton Walls became the Royal Manor of Marden during King Offa's reign. Excavations at Freen's Court in 1999 revealed a granary and possible administration block dating from the early Norman period. The present village of Marden appears to have shifted towards the North West of what is assumed to be the medieval settlement, close to the church. It would appear that this occurred during 19th century, continuing through to the present day and was due to road links and increased flooding events at the Church and its environs.

The landscape is dominated by the Iron Age Hillfort of Sutton Walls, partially excavated in the late 1940's and early 1950's prior to the western end being quarried for gravel, the fort occupies the entire top of a long, low gravel ridge aligned on an east/west axis covering an area of 10.4 hectares. Excavations suggest a high density of activity during the Iron Age and include evidence for possible Roman activity and an undated mass grave (Kenyon 1952).

The present Quarry workings at Wellington Quarry have benefitted from planned archaeological mitigation for the last 3 decades undertaken by Worcestershire Archaeology. This has built up a detailed picture of the paleo-environment and enabled detailed recording of a wide range of archaeological features and deposits dating from the Mesolithic through to the medieval period. Due to the complexity and amount of information recovered from these works, the reader is directed to their reports listed within the bibliography of this document together with Herefordshire Archaeology Report 226 (Bapty 2007).

The Historic Landscape Characterisation (HLC) data shows the immediate site's character was formed from two three types of character; Adaption of Earlier Enclosure System, which is a product of landscapes, which appear to have been adapted from an earlier historic landscape character but have not been completely redefined as the earlier process of enclosure can still be distinguished. Along with urbanisation, the other additional characters are Large and Small Compass Enclosure of the Landscape, a product of survey planning enclosure of formerly unenclosed land in the landscape by landowners in the c.18th to 20th Centuries, which can still be recognised in the straight field boundaries and organised field systems. (Figure 2).

FIGURE 2: HLC FOR THE STUDY AREA





8.1 Designated Archaeological Sites

A 1.5km radius search was carried out around the proposed quarry. The recognised features in the study area are from the Iron Age to the medieval period (Figure 3).

The most significant scheduled monument is the Iron Age Hillfort of Sutton Walls (1001747) which is located south-east of the proposed site, the views from Sutton Walls look over the the site area and have setting implications for the quarry extension. Freen's Court is located just south-west of Sutton Walls, and consists of a magnate residence and associated features of moats and fishponds (1010392).

At Wellington, west of the study area, is the last scheduled monument within the search area. This comprises a churchyard cross at St Margaret of Antioch's Church (1016346 also recorded as a Grade II* Listed Building 1348970).

There are 49 listed buildings within the study area, the majority of these are located at Wellington, which along with the aforementioned churchyard cross, form part of the conservation area of Wellington. The Church of St Margaret (1099322) is a Grade I Listed Building. The rest of the listed buildings in Wellington are Grade II or Grade II*, they are; Wellington Court (1099334), with associated Granary (1179878), Barn and Cow House (1099335) and Barn (1099336). The Parsonage (1301755) with Barn and Cow House (1179853) and Barn (1348975). Bridge Farmhouse (1179775) and Barn and Cow House (1099325). Church House Farm (1179793) with Barn (1348973), Barn and Ciderhouse (1099364), Granary (1099326), Cow House (1301774), and Barn (1172724). Bridge House (1099359), Cave House (1301806), Church Cottage (1348972), Almshouses (1348948),

Listed Buildings at Marden are much more widely distributed along the east of the study area, most relevant to the quarry extension and directly adjacent to south the proposed site, is the Church of St Mary (1302203) a Grade I listed building, with a churchyard cross (1348930), and a headstone (1099363). Nearby Church House (1348951), with associated Barn and Ciderhouse (1099364), and Old School House (1099403).

Further to the East in Marden are; Upper Paradise Farmhouse (1099365), with Hop Kiln (1348953). Bradnor (1099375), Ivy Cottage (1099376), Brook Farmhouse (1179155), Marden Chapel and House (1099401), New House Farmhouse (1099402) with Stables (1178842), Brickhouse (1099398), and the outbuildings of Wisteston Court (1302208).

To the south of the proposed site is the village of Moreton, which has the Church of St Andrew (1099254) and Barn (1172724).

Various Monuments are also listed throughout the study area, Yeoman's Monuments (1179763), Bennett Monument (1099361), the Daniel Monument (1348950), the Harris

Monument (1099362), Price and Tomkins Monument (1099324), Godwin Monument (1099323), and the Wellington War Memorial (1438043) as are two Mileposts (1179624 & 1179608)

There are two bridges in the survey area crossing the River Lugg, and are both Grade II*, Leystone Bridge (1348952) and Moreton Bridge (1099255 & 1178835).

8.2 Known Undesignated Archaeological Sites

A 1.5km radius search was carried out around the proposed quarry extension. The recognised features in the area ranged in date from the Palaeolithic to the modern period.

Prehistoric

West of the proposed quarry site is a large multi-period occupation site (HSM 5522), the knowledge of this site is a result of extensive archaeological research that has taken place at Wellington Quarry prior to the gravel and sand extraction. This multi-period site has been split into various records, Neolithic Occupation (HSM 51625), Mesolithic Activity (HSM 51624), Beaker Burials (HSM 51608), Bronze Age Occupation (HSM 51626), Middle Bronze Age Occupation (HSM 39316), Iron Age Occupation (HSM 51627) and Burials (HSM 51633). These also include a series of Ring Ditches (HSM 51626, HSM 8537, HSM 8538).

Just to the north-west of the proposed site, possible Ring Ditches or a Barrow Cemetery has been identified from cropmarks (HSM7591).

To the south-east of the site area is the Hillfort of Sutton Walls (HSM 912).

A considerable amount of fieldwalking and metal detecting has taken place to the west of the present quarry site and this has produced sixteen different Portable Antiquity record enries: (HSM 49359, 49592, 49723, 54492, 54494, 54497, 54498, 54505, 54506, 54507, 54840, 55019, 55020, 55300, 55546, 55834). Additional "casual" finds have been recorded, including a Celtic Bell, (HSM 6546) and a flint knife in Marden (HSM 8416).

This suggests the potential for significant archaeological remains from the prehistoric period to be present within the proposed extension area.

Romano-British

The archaeological mitigation work at Wellington Quarry has revealed widespread mutliperiod activity. This included Roman Occupation (HSM 5522 and HSM 51628), Roman Settlement Enclosure (HSM 8539), a Villa complex (HSM 51635), and Roman Cremations (HSM 51634). To the west, further Romano-British Occupation (HSM 48820) has been recorded. More evidence of Romano-British activity is evidenced by the presence of the Marden to Acton Beauchamp roman Road which runs to the east of the study area (HSM 58241).

The metal detecting and field walking has accounted for a number of finds and PAS records from the west of the study area (HSM 49592, 49723, 54007, 54008, 54477, 54499, 54748, 54835, 55019, 55020, 55300, 55301, 55360, 55363, 55372, 55378, 55450, 5741, 55834, 55835, 55894, 55895, 55911, 57956, 57957, 57958, 57959, 57960, 57962, 57963, 57964) and two areas of roman pottery (HSM 6543 and 7147).

Early medieval

The archaeological mitigation works at Wellington Quarry has revealed early medieval activity (HSM 51629) and two Late Saxon Watermills (HSM 51636, 51637).

Just south of the proposed site is an area, which has been suggested through folklore to be King Offa's Mercian Palace (HSM 10414). Whilst the exact location of a palace, (or any other structure which can be directly associated with King Offa) has yet to be recorded, further south is the manorial complex of Freen's Court, which contains securely dated early medieval stone and timber built structures. (HSM 10000).

To the west of Wellington Quarry, intensive and extensive metal detecting has resulted in a number of portable antiquary scheme find spots (HSM 49592, 54835, 55017, 55019, 55020, 55300, 55363, 55372, 55450, 55834, 55957, 57959, 57964) dating from this period.

Medieval

Within the study area, there are extensive areas recorded area of ridge and furrow / water meadow ridging (HSM 9558) which indicate areas of intensive agriculture possibly exploiting the flood plains of the Lugg.

Within the current Wellington Quarry, extensive archaeological work has revealed areas of medieval occupation (HSM 51630). Extensive evidence of medieval agriculture is present to the north of the proposed site, where field systems and complex water management systems have been recorded extending either side of the River Lugg (HSM 6003). These medieval agricultural areas extend north towards a medieval occupation area (HSM 6019), at Friars Mill (HSM 23301), and to the east to Wisteston Court (HSM 6549). Further to the south of this is the DMV of Wisteston Court (HSM 11146), Burgage Plots around Urdimarsh (HSM 43967), an earthwork enclosure (HSM 53261), and Wistanstow Mills (HSM 23300). This therefore suggests an area of extensive medieval occupation and use of the landscape within this part of the Lugg valley.

The western area of the field system lies within the conservation area of Wellington. Three buildings have being identified as having their origins from the medieval periods, these include St Margaret of Antioch Church (HSM 7322), a Churchyard Cross (HSM 7321) and Church House Farm (HSM 855).

Directly to the south of the study area is an area of earthwork settlement features (HSM 8532), which surrounds the Church of St Mary at Marden (HSM 6900), and earthworks that surround Marden Court Farm (HSM 43222). These are believed to represent the largely deserted medieval village of Marden. Further to the south lie extensive earthwork remains of ridge and furrow (HSM 38463). Earthworks extends further to the south as water meadow systems (HSM 31889). This lies within a complex of drainage ditches, a holloway (HSM 31891) and the Kings Mill (HSM 23299) to Freen's Court Manor and Moat (HSM 314). At Freen's Court, there are medieval buildings (HSM 10000), fishponds (HSM 10162) and enclosed formal gardens (HSM 31972). This multi period, high status, manorial complex appears to have been a focal point from the late Saxon period through to at least the mid-18th century.

Further evidence of the intensive medieval activity in this region is to the east of the site area is a possible deserted settlement at Fromington (HSM 48846), and the Church of St Andrew at Moreton on Lugg (HSM 8254).

The extensive metal detecting has also produced a wealth of finds from the medieval period, again, located around Wellington Health and have been recorded as PAS finds (HSM 49465, 49551, 49592, 53983, 53984, 53986, 54009, 54504, 54509, 54749, 54760, 54835, 55017, 55018, 55019, 55020, 55021, 55102, 55299, 55300, 55361, 55363, 55364, 55368, 55369, 55370, 55371, 55373, 55374, 55375, 55376, 55377, 55450, 55451, 55753, 55834, 55910, 55957, 57065, 57067, 57134, 57135, 57394, 57549, 57966, 57967, 58654).

Post-medieval

Activity in this period within the study area, suggests a continuation and expansion of water management features both as a form of agriculture and as a method of controlling floodwater and drainage, (HSM 48844 & 48847). This exploitation of the river to aid agrarian industry can also be seen with fisheries (HSM 23296) and catchpole weirs (HSM 23295). In addition, the construction of historic bridges built crossing the Lugg in two areas (HSM 8508 and 9099).

This pattern is present throughout whole of the lower Lugg valley, from water meadow sites to the north of the proposed site (HSM 6003), at Wellington Quarry (HSM 51638), and to the south (HSM 48845 & 7065). Most significantly, these water meadows (HSM 31889) can be seen around Sutton St Michaels and the remains of Freen's court with has a landscape park (HSM 24560), the remains of the formal gardens (HSM 31972) including dovecots (HSM 10163), Yays Cottage (HSM 31890).

The formation and expansion of large estates with landscape parks is observed all over the study area, most notably just south of the site area near the church of St Margaret is Marden Court (HSM 31184) which has a number of shrunken settlement features (HSM 8532). To the east of Marden Court is a large area of house platforms and shrunken settlement features (HSM 31033) surrounding Old School House (HSM 38462). Two non-conformist chapels lie

close to the edge of the village, (HSM 34612 and 35777). Further north, the Wisteston Court (HSM 6549) and associated Landscape Park (HSM 31215) which also has Wisteston Chapel (HSM 18947) a little further to the south of the park.

To the west is Wellington Court (HSM 46267) at the historic core of Wellington, which also includes amongst the listed buildings (HSM 856 & 861), Old Parsonage (HSM 857) and Almshouses (HSM 11186). To the south of Wellington is Moreton Court Park (HSM 24559) which later develops into Moreton-on-Lugg.

Throughout the entire study area is a larger than normal number of early farmsteads, owing to the incredibly rich and fertile agricultural land around the River Lugg and the proximity to the markets of Hereford and Leominster. Many of these have now been enveloped by the expansion villages throughout the post medieval period. These include: Brook Farm (HSM 21651), Downfield (HSM 46251), Upper Paradise Farm (HSM 38865), Brookhouse Farm (HSM 46252) and Hop Kilns (HSM 25362), Lower House Farm (HSM 46253), Church House Farm (HSM 46255) and Hop Kins (HSM 25361), Burling Gate Farm (HSM 46259), Upper Wisteston (HSM 46261), Woodbine (HSM 46262), Lower Paradise Farm (HSM 46263), Green Farm (HSM 46270), Wisteston Farm (HSM 53684), Bridge Farm (HSM 854), Church House Farm (HSM 855).

Gravel extraction was undertaken only on a local level with four sites noted around Wellington (HSM 41205, 41273, 41274, 41276).

The extensive metal detecting within portions of the study area, has produced a number of finds from the post medieval period. These are mostly located around Wellington village, where fifty PAS findspots have been recorded: (HSM 49349, 49465, 49511, 49592, 49955, 49980, 53985, 54025, 54161, 54500, 54501, 54502, 54503, 54508, 54516, 54835, 54842, 55018, 55019, 55020, 55298, 55300, 55329, 55362, 55363, 55364, 55365, 55366, 55367, 55368, 55369, 55371, 55374, 55379, 55380, 55381, 55382, 55383, 55450, 55742, 55743, 55834, 55910, 57065, 57066, 57067, 57549, 57961, 58112, 58654).

Modern

The construction of the Shrewsbury and Hereford railway (HSM 9412) and related monuments of Moreton-on-Lugg station (HSM 30838) and junction (HSM 30837) and level crossing (HSM3036). These had the biggest impact to the landscape, which borders the western edge of the study area. Other infrastructure has also been identified to this period from Toll Houses (HSM 37849) and milestones (HSM 56609, 56610).

Also present is a number of sites that related to the World Wars, including an Army Depot (HSM 27089), a Warehouse (HSM 27629), a Military Camp (HSM 27630) and a German Prisoner of War Camp (HSM 35683) all to the south of Wellington Quarry



PREHISTORIC




FIGURE 5:

ROMANOBRITISH




FIGURE 6:

MEDIEVAL




FIGURE 7: UNDESIGNATED HERITAGE ASSETS -MEDIEVAL




FIGURE 8: UNDESIGNATED HERITAGE ASSETS - POST-MEDIEVAL




FIGURE 9: UNDESIGNATED HERITAGE ASSETS -MODERN

9. Map regression

The earliest map extract available is the 1843 Tithe map (Figure 10 – area outlined in blue), the tithe map shows the field systems here prior to the construction of the railway. The majority of the proposed site is under grasslands and pasture, owing to it being a flood plain, with larges areas named Meadow, Marsh, Pasture, Berrow and Hays. Further west towards Wellington, the fields become smaller and are areas of agriculture. Fields named 'Old Fields' and 'Mill' are some suggestion of older use of the fields for early agrarian industry. There is no indication from the tithe map that any quarrying took place on this site during or prior to the 19th century. The site area covers other field parcels in the area; however, their field names do not reveal anything further concerning their use and heritage.






FIGURE 11: FIRST EDITION ORDNANCE SURVEY MAP (1886) © ORDNANCE SURVEY (100024168)




Figure 12: Fifth Edition Ordnance Survey Map (1950) \odot Ordnance Survey (100024168)

The first edition ordnance Survey map of 1886 shows the area post-construction of the railway (Figure 11). The field parcels reshaped to accommodate the new infrastructure. The majority of the site is labelled 'liable to floods'. Marden is also visible as a dispersed settlement and the historic core is present very close to the south of the site area. By the time of the fifth edition map (1945-1952) (Figure 12), the construction of the Royal Army Ordinance Cargo Depot at Wellington Marsh to the west has transformed the area into an industrial complex.

10. Landscape visualisation and setting




FIGURE 13: VISUALISED IN 3D, SETTING ISSUES OF THE VARIOUS HERITAGE ASSETS CAN BE CONSIDERED.

Using lidar data (Environment Agency 2020) of the study area was generated in 3D (Figure 13) so the setting of the various heritage assets could be considered against the landscape topography. The Quarry Extension site sits exposed on all sites, located on the low-lying flood plain to west of the River Lugg. The surrounding landscape therefore sits on slightly elevated land, although the majority of the sites identified in this study sit in the lower river valley and would not be impacted by any setting issues. This includes the village of Wellington, which is located low in the valley and at such a distance that it would not have any immediate setting impacts.

To the south-east where Sutton Walls hillfort sits on a raised hill overlooking the site area, and the close proximity of Marden and St Mary's church to the south of the Quarry extension area, both of these sites have been highlighted as having potential setting issues in relation to the proposed quarry extension.




FIGURE 14: SUTTON WALLS HAS DIRECT SETTING ISSUES FOR THE QUARRY EXTENSION SITE.

Due to its elevated position, it is clear that setting issues exist for Sutton Walls Hill Fort (Figure 14 & Error! Reference source not found.), which has direct oversight of the proposed quarry extension site. This impact is mitigated to a considerable degree by the distance that the hillfort is from the proposed site and the thick tree growth on all sides of the hillfort. With appropriate screening by the planting of tree cover and/or the bunding of spoil along the southern and eastern edges of the proposed site setting impact might be further reduced.




FIGURE 15: ALTHOUGH LOW-LYING, THE QUARRY EXTENSION SITE IS OBSERVABLE FROM THE RAMPART OF SUTTON WALLS.




FIGURE 16: VISUAL IMPACT TO THE HERITAGE ASSETS IS MINIMALISED BY THE LOW-LYING TOPOGRAPHY.

Whilst the site is low-lying in the flood plain on the adjacent banks of the River Lugg, the slight elevation to the area of the Church of St Mary at Marden, means that it may be possible to view the site from the church or the wider historic core of Marden (Figure 16). However, the

dense tree growth which currently exists on the banks of the River Lugg at this location will, to a degree, reduce the visual impact.

11. Site visit

The site visit was carried out on 15th September 2021 it was slightly overcast but bright with good visibility. The main objective of the site visit was to confirm setting issues for the locality and check to see if there were any outlying issues not forthcomming from the heritage data.

The proposed Wellington Quarry extension site is located on a floodplain adjacent to the River Lugg, it is currently open along the riverbank with very little vegetation growing to obscure it – meaning the proposed site currently sits in a very visible location where there are footpaths along the eastern bank of the Lugg (Figure 17).




FIGURE 18: THE CHURCH OF ST MARY IS SITUATED WITHIN AN AREA, WHICH IS SURROUNDED BY TREES AND OTHER VEGETATION, RESTRICTING DIRECT VIEWS TO THE QUARRY SITE.

However, the direct view from St Mary's Church at Marden is restricted by significant amounts of vegetation planting, mainly mature trees, which does enclose the church in an area where the is no direct visibility to the quarry extension site (Figure 18). Although, it is worth noting that there will be direct and unobscured views over the area from the Church tower, which is open to visitors (Figure 19) and if the quarry activity is close to the river and to Marden, it may have an impact to the setting that goes beyond just visual.

Sutton Walls Hillfort is located approximately 1.3km to the south east of the proposed quarry extension site, the hillfort itself is filled with thick bramble, ash growth and thorn, it is enclosed by high ramparts which are heavily wooded (Figure 20). The hillfort is encircled by a public footpath, which is also enclosed by thick tree cover (Figure 21). This combination means that in the majority of places there is simply no visibility from the hillfort to the surrounding landscape, or at best, it is very restricted (Figure 22).

Where there is a view of the quarry extension site from the hillfort, the distance to the quarry site and its setting within the topography in a low-lying floodplain, means that the site is almost completely hidden by the landscape and the built environment (Figure 23).

Therefore, the distance between the two sites, the vegetation cover around the hillfort and the topography of the landscape all help to minimise setting issues of the quarry extension site and Sutton Walls hillfort and effectively reduce the impact to very minor.

12. Discussion

12.1 The archaeological landscape of the search area

The lower Lugg valley is one of the more widely understood river valleys in the Britain (Bapty 2007). The archaeology that has been recorded through planned mitigation strategies at Wellington Quarry since 1986 reveals a landscape that has been widely occupied and utilised since the early prehistoric period with occupation, industrial features and evidence for changes in land use throughout the Romano-British, Early Medieval and Post Medieval periods. This unusually complete corpus of archaeological data provides a unique insight into part of lowland Herefordshire.

It was suggested by aerial photography (Cox 2001) and available HER data (Bapty 2007, Dorling 2007) which was reinforced by subsequent excavation data (Jackson et al. 2000, Arnold and Jackson 2015-2020), that the Lower Lugg Valley contains well-preserved, multiperiod archaeology. Subsequently, the evidence recovered from the existing quarry workings may be seen as a representative sample of the types and densities of the archaeological resource over much of the Lugg flood plain.

The landscape and archaeological evidence within the valley, together with its documentary links to King Offa, strongly supports a history, and a prehistory, of a well-defined land unit under the control of a social elite from at least the Iron Age through to the Medieval period.

12.2 The archaeological potential of the proposal area

Previous work that has been undertaken as part of the gravel extraction at Wellington Quarry immediately adjacent to the proposal site suggests that the site area may have considerable archaeological potential for the presence of important archaeological remains.

The extent of the archaeology of the area was revealed by HWCC from salvage recording in 1989 (EHE51616) (Clarke et al. 1987), which led to a long term programme of salvage recording at Wellington Quarry which was undertaken between 1989 and 1996 (EHE51617) (Jackson and Miller 2004). After 1996 interim salvage recording continued where necessary (EHE51617) (Napthan *et al.* 1997; Miller 2001; Patrick 2004) together with a programme of evaluations and interventions (EHE30287) (Jackson *et al.* 1999).

Large-scale survey work was undertaken through the whole of the Lugg Valley, interpreting aerial photography (Cox 2001, Dorling 2007), identified the site as one of a series of areas within the valley with high potential for buried remains of archaeology (EHE48858) (Bapty 2007).

The current programme of works which initially started in 2006 (EHE2053) (Miller and Jackson 2006) from desk based studies suggested that there was a high probability of buried remains on the site. This was confirmed by evaluation in 2000 (EHE39319) (Jackson *et al.* 2000), 2002 (EHE32268) (Griffin & Jackson. 2003), and 2006 (EHE48796) (Bain 2005) and 2012 (EHE80014) (Rogers and Arnold 2012). Thus, an appropriate programme of works was devised to allow the mineral extraction to take place but ensure that all of the archaeology was preserved by record and fully excavated prior to any quarry works taking place. This mitigation strategy has resulted in a huge wealth of information about the Lower Lugg Valley and has led to a multi-year project starting in 2012 and finishing in 2020 (EHE2057) (Arnold & Jackson 2015-2020). This has also triggered a number of smaller projects, mainly watching briefs, in the region in 2003 (EHE36591) (Miller 2003), 2008-2009 (EHE43223) (Sworn and Jackson 2008), 2012 (EHE80014) (Rogers and Arnold 2012), 2017 (EHE80298) (Arnold 2017).

The programme of works has been proven to be highly effective in expanding our knowledge of the historic environment in the region. This programme was continued when new areas were opened up in 2021 (EHE80452) (forthcoming).

There is no suggestion that the archaeology that has been revealed and recorded at Wellington stops at the railway line, and that this new site area east of the previous extraction areas will also contain a high amount of significant remains.

12.3 The impact of previous development on potential archaeological remains

The implemented programme of works from the aerial cropmark survey, to desk based assessment, evaluations, watching briefs, salvage recording and excavations have produced a huge wealth of information about the archaeology of the area, which was completely unknown before the implementation of the mitigation measures.

It is unlikely that much of the archaeological resource has been lost without being first recorded due to the extensive mitigation and research that has taken place over the years prior to mineral extraction.

12.4 The impact of the proposal of designated heritage assets Due to the low-lying landscape that the quarry extension site is located in, the majority of designated sites have been protected from direct setting impact due to the topography and the vegetation cover of the valley. There are however, three key sites, whose setting needs to be taken into account.

Sutton Walls Hillfort has a direct view of the proposed quarry extension site, although it is at some distance (1.3km). The proposed site can only be viewed from the north-western corner

of the fort and the dense vegetation and tree cover on both the ramparts and around the base of the ramparts (externally), obscure views out of the hillfort. Considerable effort has to be made to reach locations where there is some visibility to the proposed quarry extension site, and even from these few specific locations the distance and landscape and topography largely obscures the proposed site. Therefore, there will be very minimal impact to the setting of the hillfort, and this could be further reduced by the creation of bunds/embankments and tree planting around the proposed site.

St Mary's Church and other buildings within the historic core of Marden are immediately opposite the proposed site, on the eastern side of the river, ranged along a low ridge. This part of Marden is located very close to the proposed quarry area and any works in this area will have a setting impact upon church, even if there is not a direct visual impact (flooding is becoming increasingly a concern for the Church, and the affect of the quarry noise should also be considered). Although direct views of the quarry site are largely restricted by tree planting on the south-east banks of the Lugg, the proposed quarry site is currently completely open, so where views are possible it is very visible (such as along the footpath on the eastern bank and from the church tower). This should be strongly considered in situating the quarrying here and in undertaking mitigation in the form of plant buffering and banks.

Any quarrying in the proposed site may change the flood patterns of the lower Lugg Valley, Leystone Bridge is located down river of the quarry site and changes of flood patterns may cause the bridge to be under threat of increased flooding. Prior to any quarrying flood mitigation and alleviation schemes, need to be implemented to ensure heritage is not damaged by flooding.

12.5 The impact of the proposal on non-designated heritage assets

There is significant potential for the multi-period sites identified at Wellington Quarry to continue into the proposed quarry extension site. The proven success of the current programme of archaeological mitigation suggests that should any mineral extraction continue into the site area that a suitable programme of works be implemented which continue and compliment the mitigation strategy at the existing quarry. The continuation of the mitigation strategy would not only fulfil the requirements of the NPPF but is also an opportunity to learn more about the nature of river valley archaeology along the Lugg.

13. Conclusions

Herefordshire Archaeology were commissioned by Herefordshire Council to carry out a Heritage Impact Assessment for an extension to the sand and gravel quarry at Wellington, located along the eastern bank of the River Lugg in central Herefordshire.

The proposal includes extraction of these gravel deposits, which covers 3.21ha (Herefordshire Council 2021: (a) 21).

The study area around the Lugg has been demonstrated to have an extensive and rich archaeological landscape heritage. This is particularly in evidence along the western banks of the Lugg within the current quarry complex. The archaeological mitigation programmes, which were first implemented in 1986 and incorporated into a highly effective mitigation strategy have revealed a complicated multi-period site which has extensive and unique archaeological remains.

There is a strong indication that this archaeology would continue into the proposed quarry extension site, and if this area is selected for mineral extraction, it is anticipated that the existing strategy would be utilised in order to ensure that the archaeology has been properly recorded and preserved by record prior to mineral extraction.

Equally, there are other issues in the wider landscape, Sutton Wall Hillfort has direct views over the proposed site but setting impact should be considered very minimal as distance, topography and vegetation cover reduce the visual impact greatly. This can be further reduced by planting of buffering and vegetation along the edge of the proposed quarry site.

The historic core of Marden is very close to the extension site, and an area of historic buildings, which includes the Church of St Mary. Most of the direct visual impact is hidden by existing vegetation; however, any extraction which is undertaken close to the south of the site could have a negative impact upon the setting of this part of Marden. Some of this could be mitigated by adjustments of the scheme and planting of vegetation cover.

Any quarrying inside the Lugg valley floodplain, or planting or construction of buffering vegetation, could have a degree if impact to flood risk and flood patterns in the area, as such there are concerns over the bridges located downstream and at St Mary's Church at Marden. Prior to quarry works flood alleviation schemes should be drawn up to ensure that the bridges are not put at risk from flooding.

These buildings are noteworthy by their size. They are not marked on the 1720 map of Marden parish. Their proximity to Freens Court, a medieval manor house, means they are unlikely to both be medieval, so probably predate the court. Stone buildings of this size could have occurred from the Roman period onwards, the aisled building type occurs in both Roman & (rarely) prehistoric contexts. Impossible to ascertain date without fieldwork - HAW

Local landowner & friends (prof treasure hunters from Wilts) dug site & produced a number of finds. (4)

When ditched across it (to natural as site floods) found burnt wheat, pigs tusk & stone. (finds to Hereford Mus for id). (2) Owner has topsoiled over area approximating to the 2 eastern ponds to a depth of about 2' immed prior to scheduling - (Hilary White, pers comm). Archaeological excavation and research by Time Team and Herefordshire Archaeology in 1999 found that the fishponds, dams and water features date from 14th to 19th century. The moat around Freens Court was the earliest feature. The fishpond complex was probably 16th century, a linear bank by 1720. Water derived from the river Lugg. Another diamond shaped bank cut the area south of Freens Court cutting the aisled building. Other ponds associated with hempyards were located here in the post medieval. A demolition deposit west of the wall consisted of rounded boulders, not quarried stone. Tr 2 in the post building found post medieval rubble, a possible post pad, below this a stone pier of non mortared stone blocks 1.8m by 1.2m by over 1.2m deep at the south end of the trench. Moreton, plus additional land, was bought by Thomas Evans in 1861, extending the estate to almost 1000 acres. Evans also built a new mansion, further away from the road than the old house and with a larger park. W of the house lay the pleasure grounds, with a long terrace walk. A 1928 sale catalogue lists lawns with three tennis courts, an archery ground, and rhododendrons and other shrubs. A walled garden had fruit trees, herbaceous borders, box-edged paths and yew hedges, a greenhouse, other glasshouses, and three vineries. (2)

The medieval house was surrounded by a moat; this still appears on an estate plan of c. 1720, although there is now a small garden enclosure on the house's N side. The E section of the moat, facing the house's frontage, has been extended into an ornamental canal. Six pools have been created in an orchard SW of the house. Together, these features formed a water garden, possibly dating to the late 17th or early 18th century. Late 19th century OS maps show the canal but not the ponds, which have become marshland. Freen's Court had no park, but there was an avenue of trees beside the house c. 1720. (3)

Morton was one of the first US army bases to be put up in 1942. Construction was started by the US army and then interupted by the need to send men out to North Africa for Operation Torch, the invasion of Morroco and Algeria. I think it was completed by the UK army but remained an American base. I have been told that there are a series of buildings grouped round one very big one and each group held the equipment for an American Division which was around 18,000 men. Everything from toothbrushes to spare clothing and three ton trucks. (1)

The site was built as part of Operation Bolero which was a scheme to provide developed sites for the US army coming into Europe in 1942 and construction was interrupted when Operation Torch was planned. The layout was similar to that of a site at Wem but there, no large buildings have survived. An important site. (2)

The area was the site of one of the first US Army bases built in Britain in 1942. Prior to this the land had been open farmland. The supply depot was originally constructed in connection with Operation Bolero which was the prelude to Operation Overlord and the liberation of Europe. It involved the massing of troops and hardware on the mainland in order to mount large-scale attacks against the Germans across Europe by the allies. The site consisted of a mixture of Romney and Nissen huts, and was initially used for the storage of engineering and medical supplies. The huts were laid out around a small railway network connected to the mainline by a spur. Long platforms ensured the speedy entraining of both troops and supplies. Following the end of the war the base was restructured and the majority of the storage huts were replaced with three large depots which were supplied by extensions made to the World War 11 railway system. An extensive building programme was also undertaken in the early-mid 60s, with renovation and refurbishment of existing buildings being undertaken in the ensuing period. (3)

Wisteston is an ancient foundation; its chapel belonged to the knights of St John of Dinmore. The house had a 15th century hall, and was altered by the Price family in the 17th and 18th centuries. House and chapel were abandoned in the 20th century; the house is now in ruins and the chapel was demolished in 1909. The Coningsby map of Marden manor (c1720) shows Wisteston Court set amongst orchards and a hop yard. There is a walled garden with a formal gateway next to the Marden lane. An 1889 sale catalogue lists a walled kitchen and flower garden, divided into quarters. The house was surrounded by meadows with a variety of good timber. These meadows covered c.50 acres. Tree planting was denser close to the house and sparser further away. By this time, the house was reached by a drive to the E, with an avenue of chestnuts. These still survive. (1)

A very clear ridge and furrow field system can be seen on aerial photographs. (4)

The ridge and furrow is in small 'fields'. It has been cut by the road leading to Moreton Bridge. This road kinks around a cottage shown on the tithe map, suggesting the cottage, now demolished, pre-dated the road (SMR 31890). The road is present on the 1720 Coningsby map, the bridge is listed and taken to be 16th or 17th century, widened in the 19th century (1) (2).

The field system is overlain by the field pattern shown on the Coningsby 1720 map, 1840 tithe map and the present field patterns (3).

Further to the south the ridge and furrow abutts the Freens Court fish ponds. Here it seems to take account of the ponds so may be contemporary or post date the ponds. This field system offers the opportunity of understanding the spread of ridge and furrow at Marden. It must pre-date the bridge (16th century), possible post date the fish ponds (12th century?) and have gone out of use by the time of the road (16th century). A re-organisation of the landscape must then have occurred. Probably part of the same field system as SMR 38463.

Trial trenching and a watching brief on land at the site of the former military camp revealed significant archaeological remains dating to the Romano-British period, and possibly earlier. The trial trenching revealed two east-west aligned shallow linear ditches, one containing sherds of Romano-British pottery, and a similarly-aligned shallow linear ditch containing a partial horse skeleton, the size of which was consistent with an Iron Age or Romano-British date, together with an undated pit. Deep alluvial deposits sealed the natural subsoil and the archaeological features. (1)

During the watching brief, three undated similarly orientated ditches, together with two undated possible ditch terminals or pits were recorded. It is likely that all of these features are related and could be associated with drainage and/or agricultural activities. Similar features have been recorded in investigations to the north of the site at Wellington Quarry (SMR 5522). (2) The features could also be related to the Prehistoric and Roman activity recorded at Upper House Farm (SMR 10375) and St Donats Farm (SMR 30291), to the southwest of the site. (3) (4)

An evaluation carried out in 2012, in which 21 trial trenches were excavated in the areas surrounding the 2006 evaluation site, revealed a concentration of Roman features to the west of the previously-identified occupation site. These features included ditches, pits, beam slots, surfaces and a trackway. The features were interpreted as the remains of a Romano-British farmstead, with indications of occupation across the site ranging from the 1st to 4th centuries. (5)

It consisted of an unmarked flat grave, with no sign of a ditch or barrow, although the profile of the burial pit and slumped material at its edges indicated that it could have been timber-lined. The grave contained a poorly preserved adult male inhumation (probably crouched) accompanied by a rich assemblage of grave goods. The latter included a complete, Maritime (AOO) Bell Beaker. A badly decayed tanged copper knife and a shale wristguard fragment were also present along with sixteen flint items. The latter assemblage comprised four barbed and tanged arrowheads, three arrowhead blanks, three flint knives, two triangular points or small daggers and four flint flakes. The burial is of national significance, and is one of the most significant finds of this period ever made in the Midlands. Roman phase of the multi-period activity at Wellington Quarry (Overall number SMR 5522). Evidence for Roman activity was widespread, but clearly concentrated towards the north and east. By at least the 2nd Century, a large area to the east of the stream, and perhaps some land immediately to the west, was settled and a focus for intesive agricultural and industrial activites. This area includes a rectilinear enclosure identified through geophysics (SMR 8539), which is on a similar alignment to a range of field boundaries and enclosure features of Roman date. Evidence for ritual activity comprised two cremated burials found together in the far north of the area (SMR 51634). The settlement seems to have expanded in later centuries, and by the 4th century at least some of its inhabitants were highly romanised, preferring to live in substantial, well-appointed stone buildings rather than roundhouses of timber and thatch, and to use a wider range of artefacts than is found on most rural sites of this period in the area. The high status stone structures at Wellington probably represent a villa (SMR 51635). The presence of two corn driers and associated charred plant remains suggest grain production on a considerable scale. It seems likely that grain production focussed to the northeast, and settlement appears to have given way to fields and perhaps some isolated agricultural buildings. The field systems in the west and southeast parts of the quarry also seem to have been maintained through much of this period. The settlement was abandoned by the Late 4th Century/Early 5th Century (1) Evaluation prior to development of a recycling centre to the east of the villa site identified a complex of well-preserved ditches, pits and postholes. The ditches were interpreted as Romano-British enclosures and trackways. Copper and ironworking debris, a piece of hypocaust, an almost entire Dressel 20 amphora, and other pottery of local origin was recovered. (2) Evaluation at the adjacent site at Moreton-on-Lugg in 2002 identifed evidence of Roman land management, possibly associated with the estate of the villa. Radiocarbon dating of organic material from a former watercourse indicated that the watercourse had silted up, probably in the 3rd or 4th century AD. A ditch was excavated along the line of the silted up channel indicating attempts to maintain drainage. This ditch subsequently also silted up some time in the 5th or 6th century. (3) A programme of archaeological works was undertaken within the Moreton South Extension of Wellington Quarry, Herefordshire during the period 2012-2014. The work was completed on behalf of Lafarge Tarmac Limited in advance of the extension of this recently permitted area. The peat-filled palaeochannel had first been identified at evaluation and was recorded running along the west side of the investigated area. This was cut along its length by a drainage ditch of probable late Roman to early post-Roman date. (4)(5)

Early Medieval phase of the multi-period activity at Wellington Quarry (Overall number SMR 5522). No evidence was found in the 1986-96 area for activity between the early 5th Century and the 11th or 12th Century, and neither the pollen nor geoarchaeological record are sufficiently detailed to provide useful information on this period. However, post-Roman activity has been identified in the southern extension at Wellington in the form of two probable 7th/8th Century watermills (SMR 51636, SMR 51637). These suggest that at least some of the Roman fields continued to be cultivated throughout the post-Roman period. These mills provide strong evidence for a considerable level of late 7th to early 8th Century activity at Wellington. Activity of such date is only rarely encountered and thus the site is of considerable significance. This high status indicator of Early Medieval activity is of particular interest in the light of the possible status of the Roman occupation at the site. The mills may potentially represent the appurtenances of a Mercian royal estate centred upon Sutton, which is known from documentray sources to have existed by the late 8th Century, if not before, and if this estate was of a comparable size to others of known extent, it is likely to have included Wellington and its environs. A double inhumation was excavated during salvage recording at Wellington Quarry (Salvage Recording Area 3). The inhumations were found near the east bank of a stream that flowed through the east of the area. The bodies may have been placed in a grave but no definite edges or fill could be established and it is just as likely that they were placed on the ground and buried by later alluviation. Both skeletons were poorly preserved and incomplete. One of the skeletons was possibly male, aged around 17 or 18 years old at death. The other individual was possibly female, and around 30-35 years old at death. No artefacts were associated with the remains. The skeletons were radiocarbon dated to the Middle to Late Iron Age. A human skull was also recovered by contractors in the general area of the burials. This skull was probably from an adult male and is therefore unlikely to have come from the skeleton with a missing skull, as that skeleton was probably female. It probably represents the separate burial/deposition of a head, and its proximity to the other burials indicates that it was of a Later Prehistoric date. (1) (2)

Two cremated burials of Roman date were found during salvage recording at Wellington Quarry. The cremations were found together in the far north of the area, and were both placed in pits cut into the fill of a ditch, probably a field boundary. The remains of an Early Medieval watermill were recorded during salvage recording in the southern extension (Salvage Recording Area 9) at Wellington Quarry in 1996. The remains consisted of a wheel pit and surviving base of the timber frame for the wheel of a vertical watermill, by a former watercourse. The timber frame was a large structure comprising a frame of three large oak timbers and the remnants of a planked floor. Under one corner of the frame, a large broken millstone had been used along with several timber wedges to prop this corner up where it had been undermined, probably by water. Dendrochronology has dated the timbers to the Late 7th or Early 8th Century, making this one of the earliest post-Roman watermills to have been discovered in England. The remains of a substantial structure, possibly a second Early Medieval watermill, were identified during salvage recording at Wellington Quarry in 2003 (Salvage Recording Area 11). The remains consisted of a large rectangular stone building platform (presumably for a timber-framed superstructure) associated with well-preserved wooden revetments on either side of a former watercourse. Large wooden posts were also found in the centre of the watercourse. This has been interpreted as the remains of a watermill. Along with the revetments, the central posts are thought to have supported a wooden frame that spanned the channel and from which a water wheel hung. Although none of the in situ timbers of the potential mill structure could be firmly dated, one dendrochronology sample taken from a loose timber recovered in the base of channel deposits in the vicinity provided a felling date of after AD 735. This timber could not certainly be related to the potential mill, but it seems likely that the mill is broadly contemporary with the other dated structures associated with the former channel, as well as the mill identifed further up stream in 2000 (SMR 51636). Clear evidence for Post-Medieval activity was found in the northwest of the area in the form of a sheepwash on the banks of the Wellington Brook, and thin scatters of pottery and tile. The sheepwash suggests that the local economy had changed from an arable to a pastoral basis, and that the land formerly ploughed had been converted to pasture. This is supported by 19th century field names, which show a preponderance of pasture and meadow over arable land. Some land in the area continued to be cultivated for grain or fodder throughout most of the Post-Medieval period. This is supported by occasional finds of 17th to 19th century pottery and tile which were probably ploughed in with farmyard manure. It appears that the Post-Medieval fieldscape owes very little to the late Medieval pattern, suggesting that the enclosing landowners took full advantage of their opportunbity to bring about significant change. Evaluation and salvage recording at Wellington Quarry has revealed a long history of human activity on the floodplain of the River Lugg. Associated geoarchaeological evidence and environmental remains have provided a model for the changing landscape of the valley floor, thus giving a wider context for periods of occupation.

Starting with the sporadic use of the floodplain by Mesolithic hunter-gatherers, the area witnessed periods of seasonal occupation and use throughout the early prehistoric period. The most important evidence derives from a mid 4th Millenium BC pit group and the associated finds and environmental material. These were indicative of one or more periods of domestic

occupation. Domesticated animals, cereals and wild products were utilised by people exploting the resources of a heavily wooded landscape of dense alder carr, on the wet valley floor, and lime woods beyond. The pollen record provides evidence of small-scale openings, where the presence of both herbs and cereals probably reflects periodic clearances created for grazing and cultivation. Mid to Late Neolithic and Bronze Age activity within this landscape includes a pit circle, further pits and funerary monuments including a wealthy Beaker Burial.

From the start of the 2nd millenium BC, the pollen record indicates an increasingly open and cleared landscape beyond the floodplain, although fluctuations also indicate periods of woodland regeneration. On the floodplain, limited clearance and recolonisation is also evidenced, along with sporadic use by the local human population as witnessed by occasional finds from former watercourses and seasonally flooded hollows. An adjacent site at Moreton-on-Lugg has revealed a Middle Bronze Age funerary or ritual monument comprising a substantial pit surrounded by posts, while salvage recording in the area has recorded substantial quantities of Beaker through to Late Bronze Age material dumped into former watercourses. Deposits of the latter period include human remains and set a precedent for later, Iron Age, ritual use for deposition of human remains and artefacts. By this period, although swampy areas of reeds and sedges survived in the wettest parts of the floodplain, the remaining oak and alder woodland had been cleared and meadow, pasture and areas of cultivated land covered most of the valley floor.

Towards the end of the Iron Age, further evidence of the more settled and farmed landscape emerges in the form of field boundaries of Late Iron Age and Early Roman date. However, occupation appears to have lain beyond the investigated areas. By the 2nd century AD, a streamside settlement had been established on a rise in the generally flat floodplain. This formed the focus for a range of agricultural and small-scale industrial activities based in and around one or more ditched enclosures and surrounding fields. The expansion and intensification of settlement throughout the 2nd and into the 3rd Centuries, led to the establishment by the 4th Century of a well-appointed stone building.

The buildings and settlement appear to have been abandoned by the late 4th to early 5th Century and there is little evidence of any activity until the 11th - 12th Century. However, two substantial 8th Century structures have been recorded to the immediate south, on the banks of the stream on which the Roman settlement had focussed. At least one of these can be identified as a watermill and it is possible that both were associated with the Mercian Royal Estate centred on Sutton. Neither the pollen nor the geoarchaeological record illuminate this period, but information from an adjacent site shows the silting up of a Roman field drainage system and a return to wetter conditions.

The later Medieval landscape featured meadowland and possibly wasteland, especially from the 11th or 12th Century onwards when increasingly regular flooding is evidenced. However, considerable extents of Ridge and Furrow are also present on the valley floor. Along with corn drying ovens and associated features, these indicate that until at least the 12th to 14th Centuries arable cultivation continued to play an important role in the local economy. Later activity includes an 18th century sheepwash, while fieldname and cartographic evidence shows an enclosed landscape of pasture and meadow indicative of a shift away from arable cultivation during the Post-Medieval period, a pattern maintained until the onset of mineral extraction. (30) A programme of archaeological works was undertaken within the Moreton South Extension of Wellington Quarry, Herefordshire during the period 2012-2014. The work was completed on behalf of Lafarge Tarmac Limited in advance of the extension of this recently permitted area. In the north part of the investigated area, a series of Neolithic pits were discovered and occurred both in isolation and in small clusters. Neolithic pottery and flint were recovered in small but significant quantities from many of these features. Further undated but probably Bronze Age activity was represented by several waterholes associated with pits filled with fire-cracked stones. One group was associated with a sub-rectangular feature (possibly a trough) the fill of which included a large volume of fire-cracked stone. These features appear to relate to activities of the type associated with burnt mounds, and although no burnt mound was association with these pits and waterholes, some distance to the south a mound was located adjacent to a palaeochannel. The peat-filled palaeochannel had first been identified at evaluation and was recorded running along the west side of the investigated area. This was cut along its length by a drainage ditch of probable late Roman to early post-Roman date. Later features comprised a series of ditches and drains associated with a water-meadow system which has previously been mapped through aerial photography and LiDAR. Medieval and later field boundaries and land-drains were also recorded. The associated alluvial sequence comprised a strong reddish-brown silty clay underlying the modern turf line. This was cut by post-medieval and later features and sealed the palaeochannel along with Roman, Neolithic and Bronze Age features all of which were cut into a yellowish-brown deposit of prehistoric origin. Lastly a strong reddish silty clay horizon directly overlaid natural sand and gravel. (31)(32)

A programme of archaeological works (salvage recording) was undertaken by Worcestershire Archaeology during April-June 2018 within Moreton South Extension of Wellington Quarry, Herefordshire. The work was undertaken on behalf of Tarmac Limited, in advance of mineral extraction in Phase 3. As in previous phases of recording, an alluvial sequence covered the entire area. This comprised a reddish-brown alluvium underlying the turf line. This overlaid a yellowish-brown alluvial deposit of largely prehistoric date, itself overlying an early post-glacial reddish-orange alluvial unit which directly overlaid the gravel minetal deposit. To the west and east sides of Phase 3, paelaeochannels were recorded incised into the alluvium and underlying gravel. A thing and peat rich deposit also spread over a large extent of the lowest lying part of the site. These deposits and palaeochaennels had previously been investigated through use of lidar, specialist geoarchaeological assessment and trenching during the ecalustion phase of works and well as in previous monitored areas to the north.

Areas of earlier prehistoric activity were recorded on slightly higher areas of the landscape between the palaeochannels and included pits, postholes and charcoal spreads. These features are consistent with a widespread pattern of activity of this date observed at Wellington Qurry over many years, and represent the remains of temporary periods of occupation and use of this valley floor landscape by local Neolithic and Early Bronze Age communities. Iron Age and Romano-British remains were also present and included two pit alignments of apparent Iron Age date. These ran perpendicular to one of the palaeochannels and probably reflect demarcation and sub-division of the floodplain. One of the pits in one of these alignments contained an inhumation burial accompanied by a wooden staff. Dating indicates that this is most likely of Late Iron Age date like the pits. A

droveway and draingage ditches were also recorded, the latter probably reflecting Roman and early post-Roman efforts to canalise and drain the low lying areas of the site. All of this activity was focused on an area where the western palaeochannel widened and a substantial quantity of imported stone and had been dumped potentially to form a ford or adapt the flow of an active channel. The abundance of Neolithic and Bronze Age activity and cultural material in this phase demonstrates that the area was used for temporary occupation and that this formed a more concentrated focus for occupation at this date than the area immediatley to the north. The relative lack of cultural material of Roman and later date indiciates that by this time the area was in agricultural use with the potential ford perhaps being associated with transport of goods and livestock across the floodplain and towards known settlements to the west and north-east. Alluvial sequence observed in previous phases of work extended across Phase 4 with natural deposits comprising sand and gravel, overlain by alluvial horizons. A palaeochannel first identified during the project evaluation stage, was recorded running north-east to south-west across the Phase 4 area. Areas of earlier prehistoric activity were recorded on the higher areas of the landscape to either side of the palaeochannel, especially to its west. These included pits, postholes and charcoal spreads of probable Neolithic date consistent with a widespread pattern of activity of this date observed at Wellington Quarry over many years. These represent the remains of temporary periods of occupation and use of this valley floor landscape by local Neolithic communities. There was also a higher than average amount of Mesolithic material from the alluvium in this area indicating that this pattern of exploitation of the floodplain had Mesolithic origins. A post circle of probable Late Neolithic to Early Bronze Age date was also recorded providing evidence of a more permanent ceremonial presence in the landscape.

Bronze Age activity was recorded including a roundhouse and evidence of funerary activities. Taken together the roundhouse and cremation areas are suggestive of more settled patterns of occupation and associated funerary activity than observed in previous phases of investigation. Iron Age, Roman, medieval and post-medieval activity was limited to agricultural use, with the most notable activity comprising further remains of drainage ditches and watermeadow systems as have been widely recorded across the floodplain at Wellington. The building was initially investigated by Duncan James, and his report forms an appendix to this report. His assessment found that the earliest phase of the surviving building is the cross wing which dates from the early to mid-16th century, but that small pieces of evidence indicate that this originally served a medieval hall which previously stood on the site. At some point in the late 16th or early 17th century the cross wing and the earlier hall underwent significant investment which included alterations to the cross wing and the addition of a decorative scheme in both the first-floor and ground-floor rooms of the wing. Subsequently the hall area was altered, probably first in the late 17th century but again in the early 19th century. Much of the earlier form of the cross wing was concealed by later alterations until recently uncovered during renovation work. (4)

The first mention of 'Lassons bridge' found is in 1658 in the survey of the Manor of Marden which fits with Pevsner's description of a 17th-century bridge with a heightened Georgian arch. This date for its building is late when compared with the other Lugg road bridges but is borne out by the fact that the Quarter Sessions records do not mention Marden Bridge until 1737. In contrast the other major bridges were all described as 'in decay' in the previous century. The 17th-century Laystone Bridge may have replaced an earlier one on a different site for Jervoise says 'Laystone bridge at Marden is thought to have taken the place of the bridge at Wisterton mentioned by Leland'. Denell's recommendation that the bridge be raised 'as the others' fairly certainly led, as at Lugwardine, to the breaking of one arch and filling the gap with a lift-up bridge of timber. This structure was very unsatisfactory, the timber decayed and the bridge became impassable. In 1757 the raised brick arch that we see today was built by one Thomas Davies, bricklayer, who also rebuilt one of the stone arches. Subsequently, in 1815, John Gethin added an additional arch, presumably to the west where it may have replaced some sort of causeway. (2) Laystone Herefordshire Council Bridge 18. One arch was added in 1815 by the contractor John Gethin, a local bridge builder. (3)

The name Sutton Walls indicates in all probability a Roman entrenchment which formed the basis of the Mercian town. Giraldus Cambrensis in his life of St Ethelbert mentions some ruins of a castle which he saw there. Leland "notable ruines of some auncyent and great building, sumtyme the mansion of King Offa, at such time as Kenchester sttod or els Hereford was a beginning and in the next century though the ruins had disappeared the contour of the ground marked, even more clearly than it now does, the extent and position of the palace (Gough's Camden). (12)

Cropmarks at the east end of the hillfort show the walls extend to a rounded eastern edge and that there are tracks leading up to it. (13)

Description

An archaeological assessment was carried out in September 2002 in advance of redevelopment proposals for the former Royal Army Ordnance Corps (RAOC) Depot at Moreton-On-Lugg, Herefordshire. The work was undertaken by Birmingham University Field Archaeology Unit in September 2002. The area afficted by the proposed development was the site of one of the first US Army bases built in Britain in 1942. Prior to this the land had been open farmland. The supply depot was originally constructed in connection with Operation Bolero which was the prelude to Operation Overlord and the liberation of Europe. It involved the massing of troops and hardware on the mainland in order to mount large-scale attacks against the Germans across Europe by the allies. The site consisted of a mixture of Romney and Nissen huts, and was initially used for the storage of engineering and medical supplies. The huts were laid out around a small railway network connected to the mainline by a spur. Long platforms ensured the speedy entraining of both troops and supplies. Following the end of the war the base was restructured and the majority of the storage huts were replaced with three large depots which were supplied by extensions made to the World War 11 railway system. An extensive building programme was also undertaken in the early-mid 60s, with renovation and refurbishment of existing buildings being undertaken in the ensuing period.

A Time Team excavation carried out in conjunction with Herefordshire Archaeology and numerous volunteers took place in October 1999. Three areas were examined. The primary focus was the site around the demolished mansion of Freens Court (SMR 314). Some study of the Coningsby 1720 map, aerial photographs and air survey was carried out. Survey of the earthworks encompassing extensive ponds and leats was carried out by Stuart Ainsworth of English Heritage. Rapid geophysical survey by Bradford Geophysics over the buildings revealed by cropmarks (SMR 10000) was followed by three hand dug excavated trenches. Trench 1 was 8m by 3m and was located over the celled building. Trench 2 was 10m by 4m and located over the aisled building. Undisturbed subsoil was not reached in either case. Trench 3 was 10m by 2m and located over the bank of the earthworks associated with ponds. Excavation continued over three days with the Time Team crew and a further two days by Herefordshire Archaeology and volunteers. Both these trenches were in a scheduled area. A further trench of 15m by 30m was dug by machine and cleaned by hand over the cropmark feature on Downfield Knoll (SMR 10857) just to the north of Freens Court at 5227 4608. The third area examined by St Michaels church is numbered separately as 30513.

RESULTS The fishponds, dams and water features date from 14th to 19th century. The moat around Freens Court was the earliest feature. The fishpond complex was probably 16th century, a linear bank by 1720. Water derived from the river Lugg. Six ponds existed in 1720 (the time of the Coningsby map) SW of Freens court, only 3 are visible today. They were fisheries, rectangular and about 100m by 20m. After 1720 a large lake replaced the ponds and a bank dammed the lake, Trench 3 cuts this dam, 19th century pottery was found in the upper stratigraphy of T.3. Another diamond-shaped bank cut the area south of Freens Court, cutting the aisled building. Other ponds associated with hempyards were located here in the post medieval period. Trench 1 over the celled building found 3 courses of a wall of angular stones, not mortared, associated with 11th/12th century pottery. No foundation cut was found. A demolition deposit west of the wall consisted of rounded boulders, not quarried stone. Tr 2 found post-medieval rubble, a possible post pad, below this a stone pier of non-mortared stone blocks 1.8m by 1.2m by over 1.2m deep at the south end of the trench. At the north end a layer of burnt wood with vestiges of planks and charred grain was found. This was associated with 11th/12th pottery and C14 dated with 4 dates ranging from AD 830 to 1010. The Downfield Knoll site found one side of a rectangular enclosure located with

difficulty, aligned SW-NE. It was 1.2m wide with a shallow profile. There were no finds. A shallow ditch was also located, no finds. A further feature was cut by the innder ditch, this earlier feature contained one sherd of 11th century pottery.

Description

During October and November 2001, Herefordshire Archaeology undertook a preliminary study of the impact of the potato cultivation on archaeological sites within the county. The purpose of the study was to inform a national study on the management of archaeological sites within arable landscapes currently being undertaken by the Oxford Archaeological Unit on behalf of the Department of Environment, Food and Rural Affairs.

The extent of potato farming within the county is revealed and the future impacts of potato cultivation in Herefordshire are also considered. Three sites were investigated at Sutton St. Michael, Cradley and Westhide form the basis of this report. The sites at Sutton and Cradley are defined as cropmark enclosures while Westhide is a small Romano-British settlement.

All of the sites revealed damage from agricultural processes, with evidence of accelerated erosion of the buried archaeological deposits due to potato growing at Sutton and Cradley. The sites confirmed that various factors, such as slope, topographic location and crop regime would influence the occurrence of damage from arable farming on archaeological remains.

The study concludes with an assessment of the impact of potato cultivation on archaeological sites with recommendations highlighting a series of various options that may be undertaken to manage archaeological sites in arable landscapes in the future.

The Lower Lugg Archaeology and Aggregates Project aimed to improve understanding, management, protection and promotion of the visible and buried remains of past human settlement within the Lower Lugg Valley. The project stemmed from the development since the 1980s of large scale gravel guarrying in the Lower Lugg flood plain. Student research was undertaken on a pollen core collected from a palaeochannel at Wellington Quarry prior to gravel extraction. A monolith of 0.4m was collected in 1997. It was sampled from the base that was 2.2m below the surface. The monolith was collected by Liz Pearson as part of the archaeological work prior to gravel extraction. It was sent to James Iles, a student of Professor Tony Brown, Exeter University. 13 samples were analysed, 250 grains were counted on each slide. This is lower than usual as the pollen count was low. Counting of pyrite grains, loss on ignition, and pollen degradation analysis was also carried out. Results found that the core was dominated by herbaceous species, it was ntoable for the absence of aboreal and shrub pollen. Tree species were present but at 3% to 1% only. Tree species present were Pinus sylvestris, Betula, Prunus, Cornaceae, Corylus avellana, Salix. This indicated a wet, tundra environment. (1)

The sample was Radiocarbon dated to 13,000 to 12,500 before present. Dates in the Late Glacial are difficult, future dates will be done using humic acid. It probably dates to the first half of the Interstadial ('Lake Windermere Interstadial'). The core came from 390m to the north of the north section described by R Roseff in her 1992 thesis. (2)

Following on from the initial student research, Exeter University was contracted to carry out a more detailed diagram of the upper part of the sequence, which was also radiocarbon dated. (3)

Architectural interest:

* for the exceptional survival and quality of the late-C16 painted decoration in the Antiquework style; * for the survival of the early-C17 plain painted scheme; * for the survival and quality of the early-C17 counter-change ceiling over the former high end of the hall; * for the degree of historic fabric and architectural interest which survives throughout the building and which contributes to our understanding of its evolution.

Historic interest:

* for the attribution of the cartouche design in the antiquework scheme to Benedetto Battini's 1553 work 'Vigilate quia nescitis diem neque horam'; * for the evidence the building presents to reveal the social, religious and intellectual status of the society of the time.

Group value:

* with numerous neighbouring listed buildings and the Wellington Conservation Area.

History

The early history of Church House Farm is not known in detail, although it appears that it may have been in the hands of the order of the Knights Hospitallers in the early-C16. A 1936 account of Dinmore Manor by Richard Hollins Murray states that at the time of the suppression of the order in 1540, Dinmore held 'the Church House (farm), a water mill and Adford's Meadow' in Wellington. It is not clear when, and under what circumstances, this property came into the hands of the Knights Hospitaller. As an order they were founded in the late-C12, and are particularly associated with the Crusades. On the suppression of the Knights Templar in the early-C14, they received a great deal of property from the other order, although there is no evidence to suggest that their land at

Wellington was from that source. The accounts of Dinmore may provide further evidence about the nature of the Hospitallers' holding at Wellington.

A further account in 1888 of the manor of Wellington states that 'the Church House belonged to the Hospitallers of Dynmore, and was granted by Queen Elizabeth to Peter and Edward Grey and their heirs in 1577'. He cites Thomas Blount as a source for this statement; Blount was a late-C17 antiquary who compiled two manuscript volumes of history on Herefordshire. Blount's information stems from a grant recorded in the Patent Rolls of land at 'Wyllington' in Herefordshire. This is part of a large grant of land to 'the Queen's servant Peter Greye' and his son Edward, which includes parcels of land all over England. Given the scale of the grant to Peter and Edward Grey, it is unlikely that they had any direct involvement in Wellington. By the early-C19 and the time of the tithe survey in 1842, Church House Farm was in the ownership of John Harris, and tenanted by John Meats.

The present house at Church House Farm is a multi-phase building which appears to have begun as a hall, probably in the C15, likely to have been two bays with a single bay solar at the west end and a single service bay at the east end. Evidence for this single storey hall is supported by the shadow of a roof pitch now at first floor level, in the timbers of the adjacent cross wing, and the lack of first floor doors in that wing. The cross wing itself seems to have been added in the early-C16, replacing the solar wing of the hall, which had been axial with that range. As constructed, the cross wing appears to have been of two storeys with a single four-bay room at both ground and first floor levels, and roofed at right angles to the axis of the presumed earlier hall. Access between the two floors is thought to have been at the northern end of the wing, where there is evidence suggesting the location of a stair. The cross wing appears to have been unheated originally, and there is evidence in the surviving fabric of the west elevation that it had a garderobe tower, and oriel windows on its west and north elevations. Some timber framing survives in the south elevation, although its original external appearance is not known. As it was almost certainly the principal facade of the house, it is possible that it had close studding or more elaborate framing, as is frequently seen in surviving examples.

Within a relatively short period after the construction of the cross wing a series of modifications were made which appear to have been intended to upgrade the accommodation available. This included the construction of a chimney and fireplace to heat the ground floor room and the insertion of a cross wall on both levels to separate off the northern bay of the wing, possibly to formalise a circulation space with a stair. At this time, the main first floor chamber was provided with a painted decorative scheme. In the original hall a decorative counter-change ceiling was inserted in the upper bay, adjacent to a large inserted stack which had replaced the original open hearth and which divided the upper and lower bays. In the late-C16 or early C17, the original hall seems to have been substantially reconstructed to provide a building of two full storeys, but retaining earlier features such as the counter-change ceiling.

In the C18, there appears to have been a fire which prompted the rebuilding of the house to much its present appearance. This involved the reconstruction of the roof, removing its gables, the rebuilding of the south facade in stone, and the north facade in brick. The newly fashionable stone facade had a central doorway which was later blocked and the main entrance moved west to its present position. The interior was remodelled at this time and some internal features survive from this period.

During renovation work in around 2018, the owners revealed surviving elements of painted decoration in the cross wing at both ground and first floor levels. At ground floor level, the scheme seems to have been what is described as a 'plain scheme', with the painting of the timber studs in the room with a dark red paint, interposed with white paint used on the infill panels, creating a striped pattern running around the room. Only small fragments of this scheme have been exposed and are known to survive; there may be more which survive beneath later coverings. It is thought that this painted scheme may date from the early-C17; it is not known if it is contemporary with the decoration in the first floor room above. There is a small section of ceiling plaster in the south-west corner of this room which is contemporary with the painted decoration of the room.

In the first floor room the decorative scheme appears to have covered all the wall surfaces and comprises a series of figurative schemes and various 'antiquework' motifs set within a framework of architectural features. Antiquework style decoration was popular in the C16; its use signified knowledge of the classics and was used by members of the gentry to highlight their status. The paintings at Church House Farm have been dated to the late-C16 and use principally vernacular pigments such as red oxide, yellow ochre and red lead. The additional use of indigo and orpiment points to the execution of the scheme by a professional painter. The present owners of the property have identified a print source for the strapwork cartouches which form the frieze of the decoration: Benedetto Battini's 'Vigilate quia nescitis diem neque horam' which was published in Antwerp in 1553. No other sources have thus far been identified.

Details

A C15 hall house, modified in the C16 with the construction of a cross wing. Modified again in the C17 with the insertion of a first floor in the hall, later rebuilt as a two storey hall. Substantially rebuilt in the late-C18 or early-C19 and subsequently modernised.

MATERIALS: the pre-C18 parts of the building are largely timber framed with plaster and brick infill panels. The late-C18 rebuilding was in stone and brick with a slate roof.

PLAN: the house is orientated roughly east-west with its former associated farm buildings to the west. It stands behind a large forecourt with brick and stone boundary walls, and has a single storey outbuilding range to the east which runs roughly north-west to south-east.

EXTERIOR: the principal facade of the house faces south and in its present form is the stone facade dating from the late-C18 or early-C19 remodelling; this is a wide, stone frontage beneath a hipped slate roof with chimneys at each end and an off-centre stack. The main portion is broadly symmetrical and corresponds with the former hall range within; it is three bays wide with the former central door now blocked. The windows are casements within arched surrounds, the main door is in the left portion of this blocked in a dressed stone surround and is a timber panelled door with glazed upper section. The part of the facade west of the main block corresponds with the cross wing within. This is slightly recessed from the main block and has a sash window to each floor. At the east end is a single storey lean-to.

The rear of the house is in brick with varied fenestration. The western end, which is the rear of the cross wing, is timber framed with brick infill panels and an external access to the cellar. Adjacent to this is the projecting stair tower which is of brick but with partial stone base, perhaps from an earlier incarnation. Beyond this the facade is of brick and there is a single, full-height post which is thought to be part of the rear of the hall range as reconstructed in the C17.

INTERIOR: the historic layout of the house is discernible although now much altered. The main door opens into a hall at what was the high end of the hall. The counter-change ceiling which was inserted into the hall mostly survives; it now covers this hall and the adjacent living room which has a wide stone fireplace. The ceiling has deeply chamfered principal beams and exposed joists which are also chamfered with decorative stops. The eastern end of the house has been remodelled at ground floor level and is largely of modern character.

The ground floor southern room of the cross wing has a timber cupboard with alcove above and a fireplace dating from the C18 remodelling of the house. There are remnants of an earlier fireplace adjacent to the latter which appears to date from before the subdivision of the cross wing and there is evidence of an earlier plaster cornice. This room contains a surviving plain painted decorative scheme which appears to have been formed of deep red painted posts with white infill panels, creating a striped effect. Small sections of this are known to survive and it is likely that there may be more hidden beneath later coverings. A timber-framed partition divides the cross wing at both levels with now blocked doors between the rooms. In the small room beyond this there is evidence in the ceiling which suggests the location of the original stair.

Beyond the cross wing, in the projecting stair tower, a C19 timber stair with stick balusters gives access to the upper floor. There is a secondary timber stair at the east end of the house.

At first floor level, the rooms in the main block contain few features of particular note. The south-facing room adjacent to the cross wing has the exposed timber frame of the cross wing wall; this has partially weathered timbers above the shadow of a former roof line which appears to denote the roof of the original hall. This room also has deeply chamfered ceiling beams with some sections of moulded timber.

The main first floor room of the cross wing has the painted decorative scheme. Surviving elements have been exposed on the east and west walls, and on the northern inserted wall dividing the cross wing. The south wall, having been rebuilt, is presumed to not retain any decoration. As exposed, the east wall appears to have the best survival with most of the wattle and daub infill panels surviving as well as the decoration on the majority of the posts, studs and rails. It also seems likely to have been the main focal point of the decorative scheme. The elevation appears to have been divided into seven panels of varying sizes, symmetrically arranged with a large central panel. The panels are divided by columns with decorative capitals reminiscent of Corinthian heads. The central panel is occupied by a large figurative scene, largely created from simple black lines on the pale background of the plasterwork. This has two large winged cherubs, who are holding what appear to be stems of flowers in one hand and with the other supporting a large, centrally placed fleur-de-lys which they appear to be about to place on a pedestal. Flanking the pedestal are a pair of winged grotesque figures. To either side of this central panel appear to have been a pair of narrower panels containing geometric patterns of intersecting shapes.

Further to the left of the northern geometric panel a surviving panel comprises a further central pedestal supporting a vase with various fruits and leaves emerging, this is flanked by two winged creatures. The detail of the head of only one of these survives and it has a protruding tongue, and, sitting above its head is a pot which it appears to be supporting. This is largely formed of simple black lines on a dark red background. This was presumably mirrored on the southern side as the arrangement appears to have been largely symmetrical, but that panel towards the south is missing. Finally the southernmost surviving panel is narrow with the same geometric patterning as flanks the central panel with a blue background. This was presumably mirrored at the northern end, although the northernmost panel has been destroyed by a later inserted doorway.

The pattern of columns dividing the main bays of the decorative scheme rises as far as a large frieze which runs along the length of the east wall. This has strapwork cartouches running along it, in varying degrees of survival, alternating smaller panels with longer ones. The longer panels appear to have originally borne religious text. One to the south survives intact and reads 'LOVE GOD'.

On the northern and western walls only fragments of the painted scheme have been uncovered, largely sections on timberwork. This is sufficient to show that both the doorway to the smaller northern room and that to the garderobe are decorated, with columns similar to those on the east wall. The remainder of exposed fragments appear to echo similar arrangements to that on the east wall, including some suggestion that the same frieze ran along the west and north walls.

SUBSIDIARY FEATURES: the house stands behind a wide forecourt which is bounded by brick side walls and stone walls adjacent to the road. To the east there is single storey stone outbuilding with timber roof structure.

Wellington War Memorial is listed at Grade II for the following principal reasons:

- * Historic interest: as an eloquent witness to the tragic impact of world events on the local community, and the sacrifice it made in the First World War:
- * Architectural interest: a simple yet striking memorial cross in Cornish granite;
- * Group value: with the Church of St Margaret of Antioch (Grade I), the church cross (Grade II*), tombstones (Grade II) and Church Cottage (Grade II).

History

The aftermath of the First World War saw the biggest single wave of public commemoration ever with tens of thousands of memorials erected across England, both as a result of the huge impact the loss of three quarters of a million British lives had on communities and the official policy of not repatriating the dead, which meant that the memorials provided the main focus of the grief felt at this great loss.

One such memorial was raised at Wellington as a permanent testament to the sacrifice made by the members of the local community who lost their lives in the First World War. It commemorates 16 local servicemen who died during the First World War.

In 2010 the memorial was cleaned and the lettering re-painted with the help of grant aid from War Memorials Trust.

Reasons for Designation

A standing cross is a free standing upright structure, usually of stone, mostly erected during the medieval period (mid 10th to mid 16th centuries AD). Standing crosses served a variety of functions. In churchyards they served as stations for outdoor processions, particularly in the observance of Palm Sunday. Elsewhere, standing crosses were used within settlements as places for preaching, public proclamation and penance, as well as defining rights of sanctuary. Standing crosses were also employed to mark boundaries between parishes, property, or settlements. A few crosses were erected to commemorate battles. Some crosses were linked to particular saints, whose support and protection their presence would have helped to invoke. Crosses in market places may have helped to validate transactions. After the Reformation, some crosses continued in use as foci for municipal or borough ceremonies, for example as places for official proclamations and announcements; some were the scenes of games or recreational activity. Standing crosses were distributed throughout England and are thought to have numbered in excess of 12,000. However, their survival since the Reformation has been variable, being much affected by local conditions, attitudes and religious sentiment. In particular, many cross-heads were destroyed by iconoclasts during the 16th and 17th centuries. Less than 2,000 medieval standing crosses, with or without cross-heads, are now thought to exist. The oldest and most basic form of standing cross is the monolith, a stone shaft often set directly in the ground without a base. The most common form is the stepped cross, in which the shaft is set in a socket stone and raised upon a flight of steps; this type of cross remained current from the 11th to 12th centuries until after the Reformation. Where the cross-head survives it may take a variety of forms, from a lantern-like structure to a crucifix; the more elaborate examples date from the 15th century. Much less common than stepped crosses are spire-shaped crosses, often composed of three or four receding stages with elaborate architectural decoration and/or sculptured figures; the most famous of these include the Eleanor crosses, erected by Edward I at the stopping places of the funeral cortege of his wife, who died in 1290. Also uncommon are the preaching crosses which were built in public places from the 13th century, typically in the cemeteries of religious communities and cathedrals, market places and wide thoroughfares; they include a stepped base, buttresses supporting a vaulted canopy, in turn carrying either a shaft and head or a pinnacled spire. Standing crosses contribute significantly to our understanding of medieval customs, both secular and religious, and to our knowledge of medieval parishes and settlement patterns. All crosses which survive as standing monuments, especially those which stand in or near their original location, are considered worthy of protection.

The remains of the churchyard cross in St Margaret of Antioch's Church represent a good example of a medieval standing cross with an octagonal stepped base. Situated in a prominent location immediately to the south east of the south porch, it is believed to stand in or near to its original position. The cross has not been significantly restored, and has continued in use as a public monument from medieval times until the present day.

History

Details

The monument includes the remains of a standing stone cross located within the churchyard of St Margaret of Antioch's Church approximately 13m to the south east of the south porch. The cross, which is Listed Grade II*, is medieval in date. It is of stepped form and includes a base of four steps and a socket stone, and the shaft. The steps are octagonal in plan. The bottom step measures 3.92m in diameter. The socket stone, which is set into a hole in the top step, is rectangular in plan and rises through chamfered corners to an octagonal top. It measures 0.91m east to west by 0.79m north to south and is at least 0.29m in height. The shaft is mortised into the socket stone and bonded with lead. It is 0.37m east to west by 0.32m north to south at the base, rising through chamfered corners in tapering octagonal section to a height of 3.28m. The top of the shaft has been broken off at an angle. The overall height of the cross is approximately 4.59m.

Reasons for Designation

A magnate's residence is a very high status residence of domestic rather than military character. Such dwellings were the houses or palaces of the highest ranks of society, acting both as luxury residences for the elite and their large retinues, and as settings for meetings. These monuments were formed as a complex of buildings, usually of stone, and in general comprised a great hall or halls, chambers, chapels, kitchens, service rooms, lodgings and a gatehouse, usually arranged around a single or double courtyard. Magnate's residences were in use throughout the whole of the medieval period from the Norman Conquest and due to their connection with highest ranks of society and their comparative rarity, surviving examples are considered to be of national importance. Freen's Court acted as a magnate's residence from the early medieval period until it was replaced by another prestigious residence, surrounded by a moat, in the later medieval period. Moats also form a significant class of medieval monument, important for understanding the distribution of wealth and status in the countryside. Many examples provide conditions favourable to the preservation of organic remains. The magnate's residence and moated site at Freen's Court are both well preserved examples and with the fishponds will retain considerable potential for the survival of archaeological and environmental evidence. The magnate's residence is possibly also the location of the palace of the Anglo-Saxon king, Offa.

History

Details

The monument lies on the south side of Sutton St Michael, just to the west of St Michael's church. The magnate's residence has been identified from aerial photographs and by a detailed geophysical survey of the area. The survey evidence shows the buried walls of a substantial building orientated north east, south west, and measuring approximately 25m x 8m. An internal wall at the north east end divides an end chamber from the large hall. There are smaller adjacent rooms on the south west end of the residence. On the north east side, there is a large rectangular ante chamber orientated along the same axis as the main building and measuring 11m x 4.5m. To the south east a double row of post holes or post support pads of a second large building has been identified. This structure is orientated north west, south east and measures 30m x 10m. Both medieval and post medieval

metalwork, including a coin of Edward I dated to 1280, were recovered in the area of the first building in April 1991. To the east and north of the residence lie the remains of Freen's Court, a medieval moated site, which covers an area measuring approximately 90m x 80m. The sub-rectangular moat, shown on a map of 1720, is infilled except for the south arm and part of the east arm, and a ditch extending south west from the east arm. The flat bottomed ditch on the south side of the moat is 12m wide and 2.5m deep; the ditch extension from the east arm is 10m wide and 2m deep. The moat island, which is raised 0.5m above the surrounding land level, was the location of a 16th century manor house which is believed to have been constructed on the site of a medieval building. To the west of the moated site, within an area measuring approximately 120m x 135m, lies a marshy depression which was the location of six rectangular fishponds. The moat and ponds are naturally waterlogged and in the past were connected to the River Lugg which runs just south of the site. Around the site, a ditch 0.5m deep with a wide, shallow outer bank, forms a five sided enclosure which encompasses the moat, the large buried buildings and the fishponds. Maps and place-name evidence strongly suggest that this area was also the location of a substantial Anglo-Saxon dwelling and it is recorded that St Ethelbert was murdered by King Offa of Mercia whilst a guest at his royal palace in Sutton. The plan of the stone buildings may indicate continuing use from the early medieval period and it is considered possible that this is the site of the hitherto unlocated Anglo-Saxon palace of Offa. The enclosure ditch may also be associated with early medieval occupation. The drainage ditch on the south of the site which follows the line of the outer enclosure ditch is excluded from the scheduling.
