

Targeted Short Breaks Allowance - what can it be used for?

The Targeted Short Breaks Allowance is to help children with disabilities to take part in leisure activities whilst allowing the person/s that care for them to have a short break.



Funding can be spent on a wide range of things including:

- Leisure activities dependent on your child's interests such as:
 - Swimming
 - Bowling
 - o Cinema/ theatre
 - Trampoline parks
 - o Soft play parks
 - Leisure centres
 - lce skating
 - o Horse riding
 - o Youth clubs / leisure clubs
- Group activities and play sessions with other children
- Payment to a carer who is accompanying the child to do an activity / have a day out
- If your child needs specialist equipment in order to take part in leisure activities, this may be acceptable in some circumstances so please contact Short Breaks

Funding cannot be used for costs that any parent would pay for their child, regardless of their disability, such as:

- Activities, days out or holidays for the family
- Hire of holiday accommodation / caravans / camp site
- Transport (Petrol, Taxis, Trains) and parking costs for your child to attend activities and return home
- Incidental costs such as meals & refreshments
- Siblings and/or friends to join them in the activities
- Payments to relatives who live in the same household.
- Items, goods or services that do not provide activities for the named child and a break for you as a parent such as:
 - Clothing
 - Groceries
 - o Utility Bills, TV licence, Council Tax
 - Deliveries and takeaway food
 - Mobile phone repair & bills/top up
 - Subscriptions for household services (i.e. streaming services such as Amazon or Netflix etc.)
 - Direct Debits/Standing Orders
- Funding should not be used for resources in the home such as play/sensory equipment, IT equipment, computer games, garden play items or gym equipment.

Monthly transaction audits are carried out and you will be contacted about any inappropriate spend identified
