

Church Stretton Swimming Pool



Key facts

Location: Church Stretton Swimming Pool

Grant recipient: Shropshire Council

Purpose: Originally constructed in 1971 as an outdoor pool and was subsequently covered by the current 'A frame' pool hall building in the 1980s; the changing areas are housed in older buildings dating back to the early 1900s.

A new build leisure centre was linked to the pool building in 2010.

Building Management System (BMS)



Energy efficiency measure: Building Management System

A Building Management System (BMS), is a computer-based system installed to control and monitor a building's electrical equipment such as ventilation, lighting, energy, fire systems, and security systems. This decreases operating costs and provides enhanced system performance.

Predicted energy saving: 50.356 kWh

Anticipated cost saving = £2,114.11/yr

CO₂ savings/yr: 9.3 tCO₂e

Financials

System Cost: £16,489.75

Funding: 60% ERDF Sustainable Energy in Public Buildings
40% Shropshire Council Capital funding

Predicted payback to Council: 4.6years
