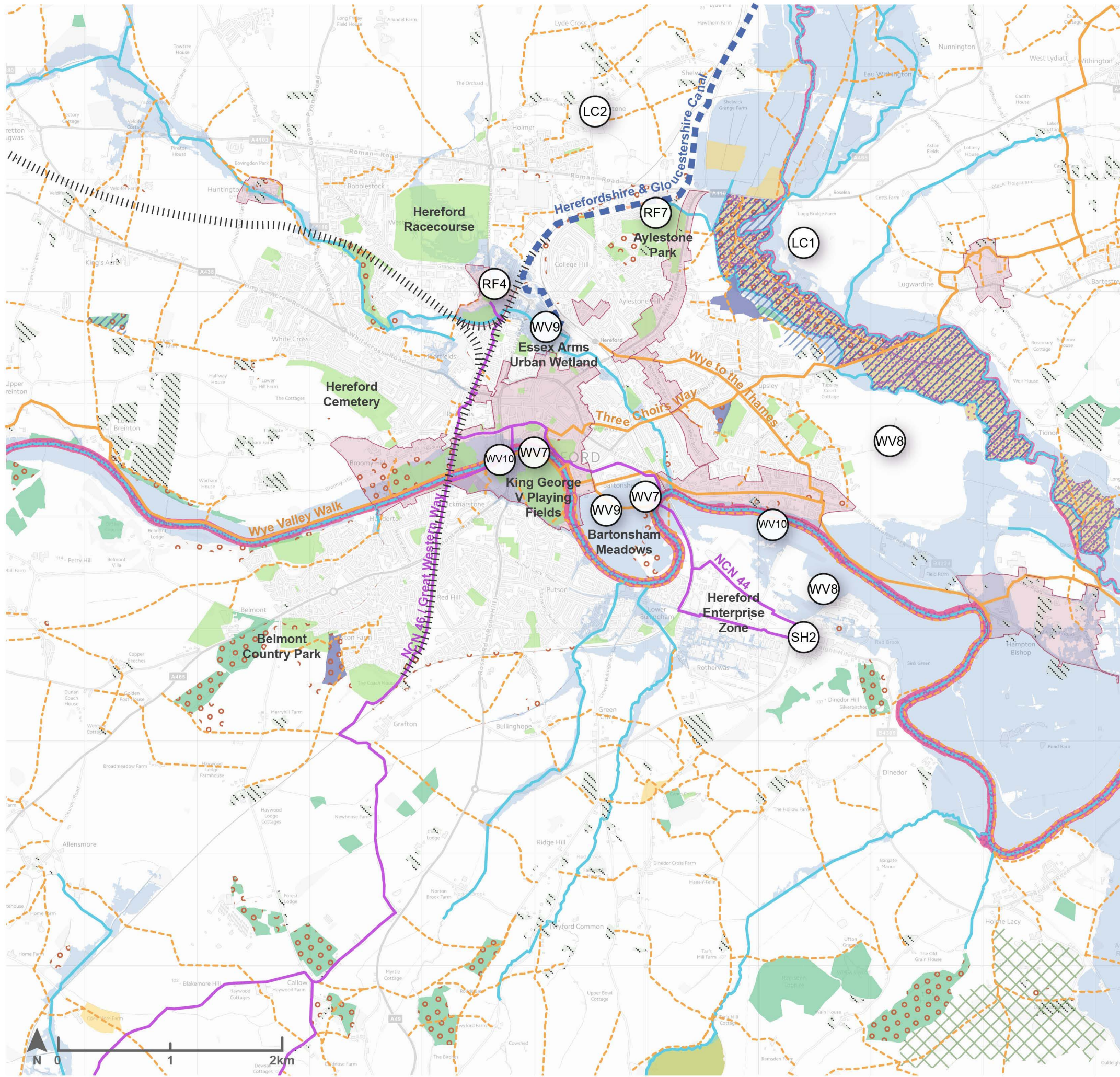


Figure 6.15: Existing GBI within Hereford and opportunities for enhancement

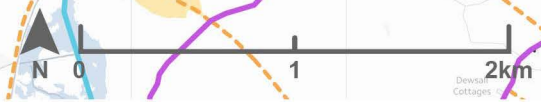
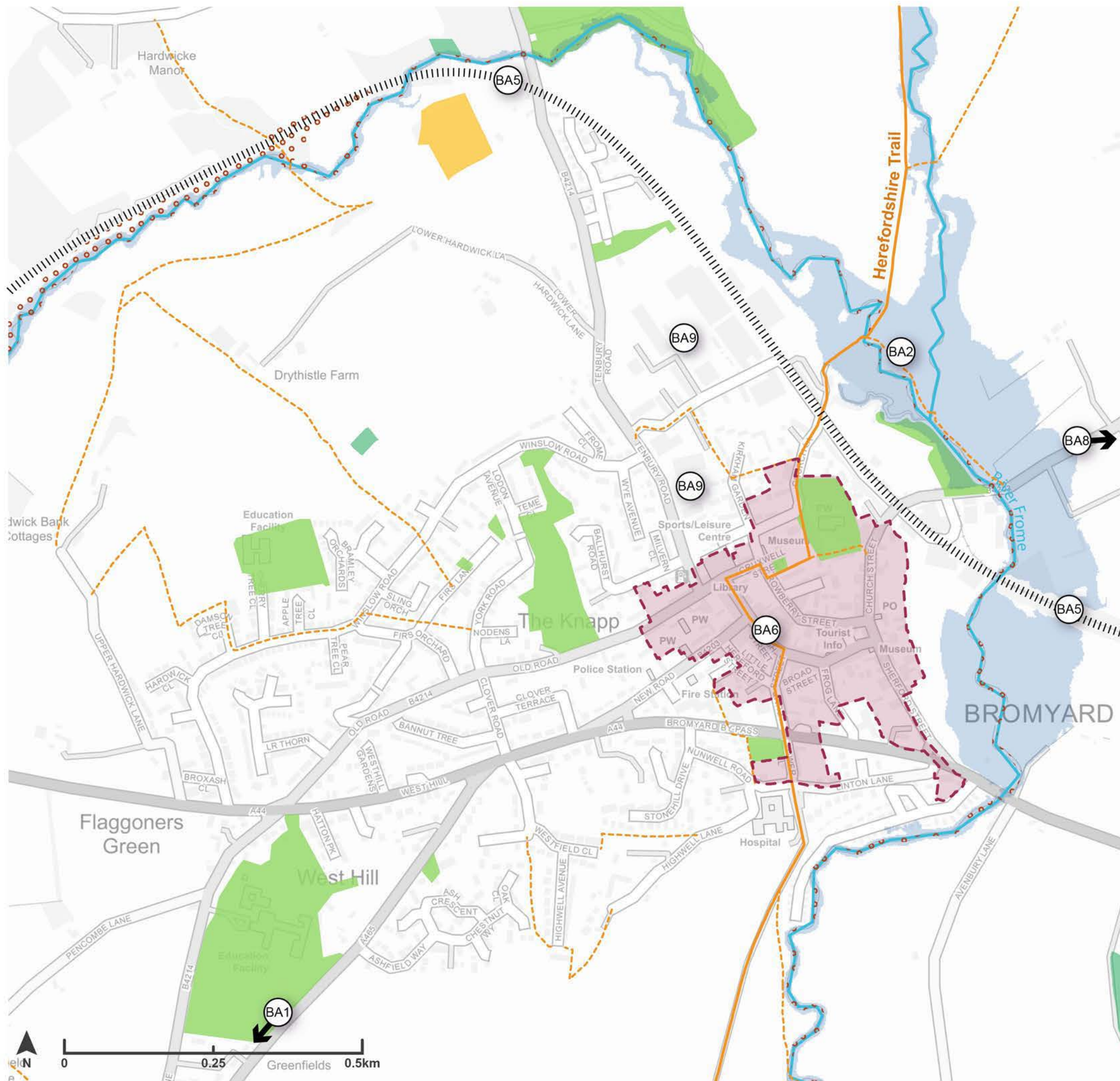


Figure 6.16: Existing GBI within Bromyard and opportunities for enhancement

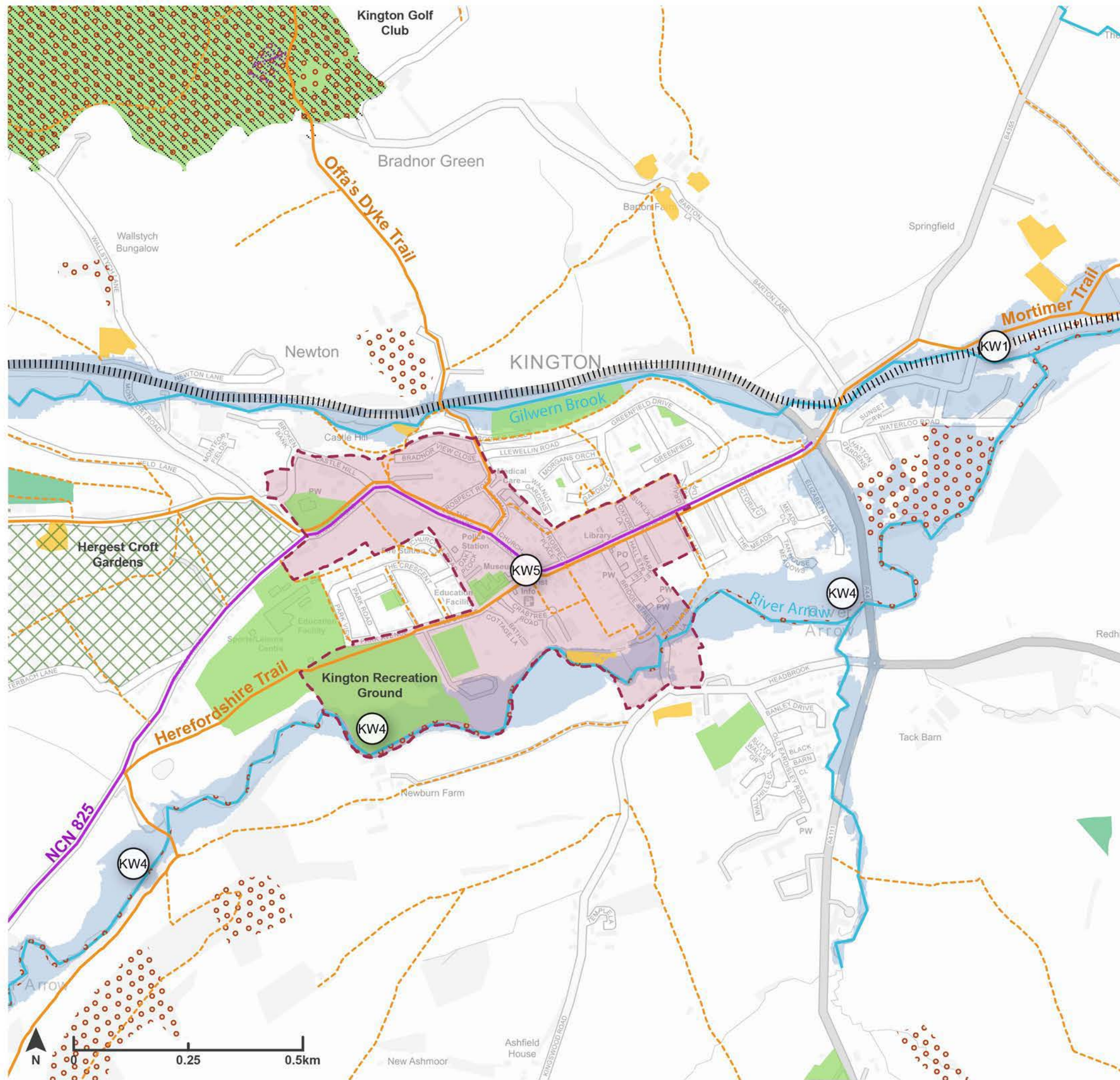

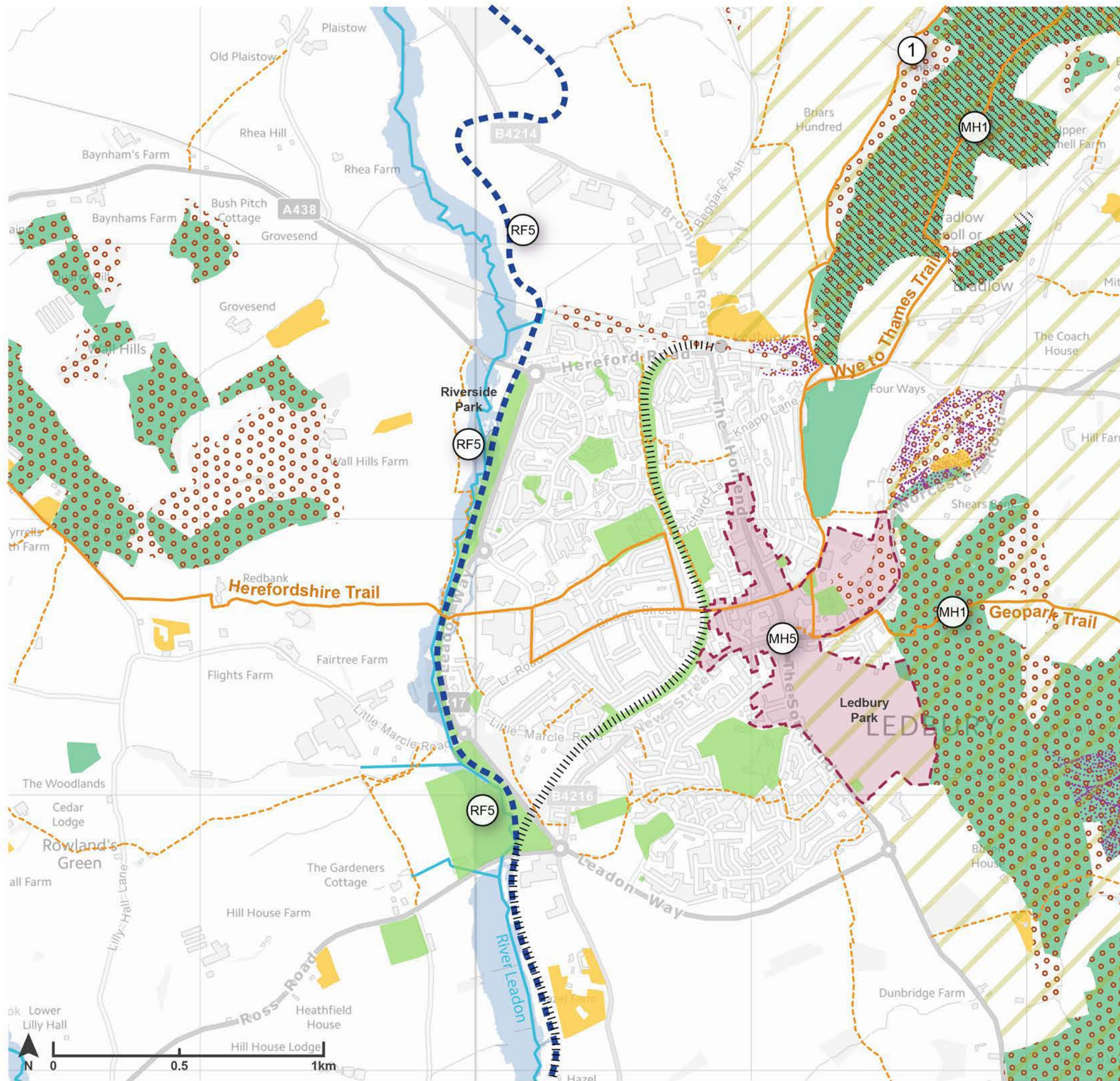


Figure 6.18: Existing GBI within Ledbury and opportunities for enhancement

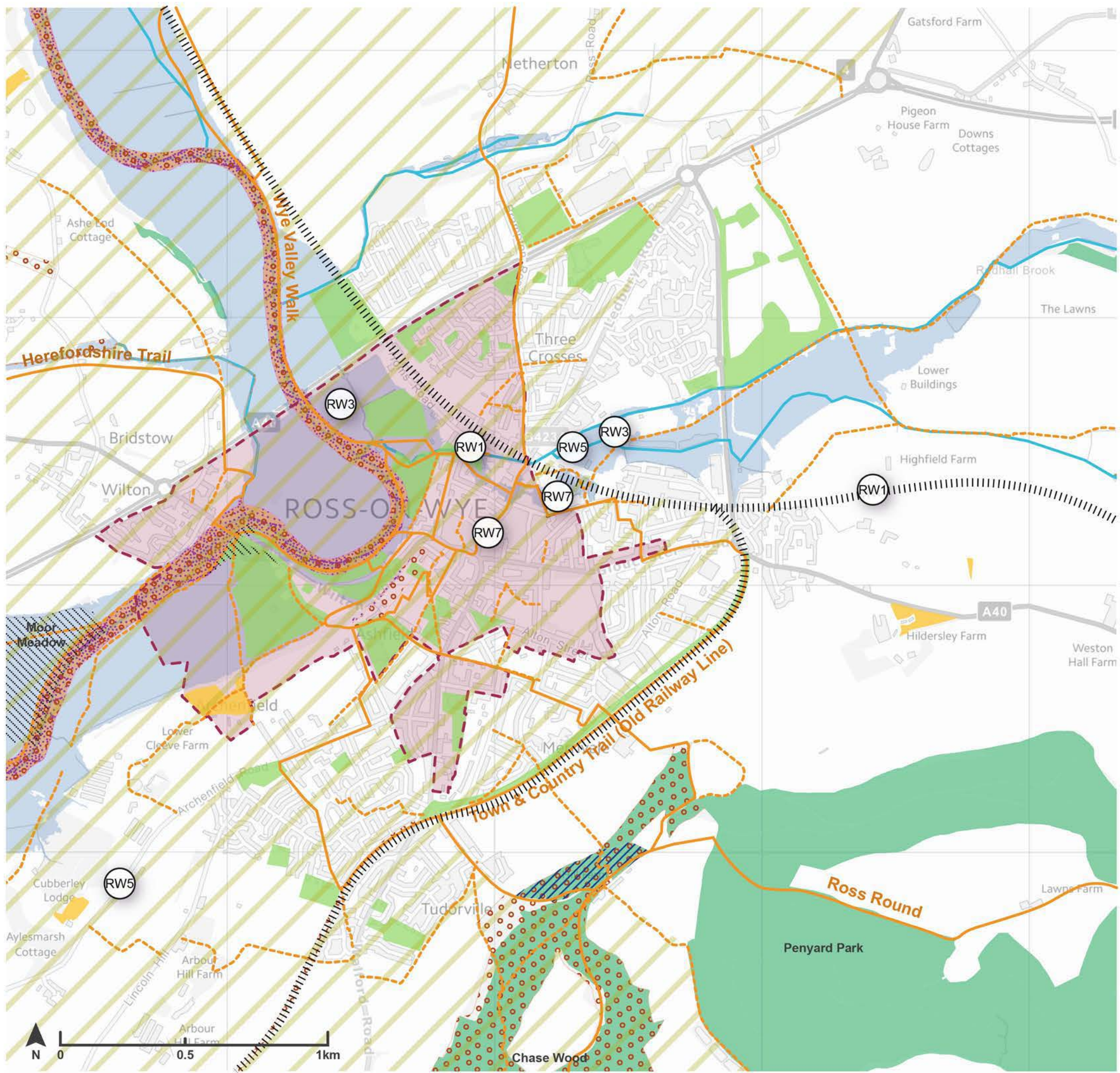


Figure 6.20: Existing GBI within Ross-on-Wye and opportunities for enhancement
