

NOTICE OF MAKING

HEREFORDSHIRE COUNCIL

(B4214 EDWYN RALPH) (30MPH SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 2022

AND

(B4214 EDWYN RALPH) (PROHIBITION OF OVERTAKING) ORDER 2022

Notice is hereby given that the County of Herefordshire District Council, known as Herefordshire Council, in exercise of its enabling powers under sections 1, 2, 3, 4 and 84 of Part I and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 has made the above-named orders the effect of which will be the following:

- 1. That no person shall drive a motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 30 miles per hour along the lengths of road specified below; and**
- 2. No vehicle shall be permitted to overtake any other moving vehicle along the lengths of road specified below:**
 - **B4214** from a point 366m south west of its junction with U65035 The Crest to a point 195m north east of this junction – in both directions
 - **U65035 The Crest** to the limit of its adoption – in both directions

This Order shall come into operation on 16th December 2022.

If any person wishes to question the validity of the Order or of any of its provisions on the grounds that it or they are not within the powers conferred by the Act, or that any requirement of the Act or of any instrument made under the Act has not been complied with that person may, within six weeks from the date the Order was made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.

Any representations received by the Council may be imparted to third parties. We will keep your data for up to 7 years. Your information may be shared with other Balfour Beatty teams within Herefordshire and Herefordshire Council in order to provide you with the service. Individuals have a number of rights under data protection law, including the right to request their information.
