NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

HIGHWAYS ACT 1980 SECTION 26

HEREFORDSHIRE COUNCIL PUBLIC FOOTPATH KP18 (PART) KING'S PYON PUBLIC PATH CREATION ORDER 2023

On 15th April, 2024 Herefordshire Council ("the Council") confirmed the above order made under Section 26 of the Highways Act 1980.

The effect of the order, as confirmed, is to create that part of Public Footpath KP18 in the Parish of King's Pyon which commences at a field gate at the junction with footpath KP10 at OS Grid Reference SO 4306 5004 (point C on the order plan) and follows a generally northerly direction for approximately 253 metres to OS Grid Reference SO 4308 5028 (point D on the order plan) then in a westerly direction for approximately 144 metres, then in a northerly direction for approximately 10 metres to OS Grid reference SO 4293 5030 (point E on the order plan). It continues in a generally westerly direction for approximately 234 metres to OS Grid Reference SO 4270 5028 (point F on the order plan) then a north-north-westerly direction for approximately 104 metres to OS Grid Reference SO 4268 5038 (point G on the order plan) before turning in a westerly direction for approximately 130 metres to OS Grid Reference SO 4255 5037 (point B on the order plan). The total length of the proposed new route is 875 metres.

Confirmation of this order shall be concurrent with the confirmation of the County of Herefordshire District Council Footpath KP18 (Part) King's Pyon Public Path Extinguishment Order 2023.

This order comes into force at the end of 7 days of the said confirmation date of the order but if any person aggrieved by the order desires to question its validity or that of any provision contained in it on the ground that it is not within the powers of the above Act, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act, or any regulation made under it has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the order, he or she may, pursuant to paragraph 2 Schedule 2 to the Act, as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 6 to the Act, make an application to the High Court for any of these purposes under Section 26 of the Highways Act 1980 within six weeks from the date of this Notice.
