Notice is hereby given that the County of Herefordshire District Council, known as Herefordshire Council, in exercise of its enabling powers under Sections 1, 2 and 3 of Part I and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act, and of all other enabling powers make the above Order, the general effect of which will be to introduce: No Waiting at Any Time (Double Yellow Line) restrictions on the following lengths of road:

Aylesbrook (Western Side) From its junction with A4103 Roman Road for a distance of 42m in a southerly direction. **Aylesbrook (Eastern Side)** From its junction with A4103 Roman Road for a distance of 36m in a southerly direction.

This Order will come into effect on **22nd July 2024**.
