HEREFORDSHIRE COUNCIL PUBLIC FOOTPATH LX8 (PART) LEINTWARDINE PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER 2024

The above order made on 15th July, 2024 under Section 119 of the Highways Act 1980 will divert that length of Footpath LX8 (Part) in the Parish of Leintwardine which commences at OS Grid Reference SO 4039 7560 (point A on the order plan) and proceeds in a generally north north-westerly direction for approximately 56 metres to OS Grid Reference SO 4037 7566 (point B on the order plan) and then in a generally north-westerly direction for approximately 31 metres to OS Grid Reference SO 4035 7568 (point C on the order plan). The total length of the existing said footpath is approximately 87 metres.

An alternative footpath will be created, being 2 metres in width, which commences at a kissing gate at OS Grid Reference SO 4040 7561 (point D on the order plan) and proceeds in a generally north north-westerly direction for approximately 65 metres to a kissing gate at OS Grid Reference SO 4038 7566 (point E on the order plan), then in a west north-westerly direction for approximately 28 metres to OS Grid Reference SO 4035 7568 (point C on the order plan). The total length of the said proposed new footpath is approximately 93 metres.
