NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

HIGHWAYS ACT 1980 SECTION 119

**HEREFORDSHIRE COUNCIL
PUBLIC FOOTPATH YP6 (PART) YARPOLE
PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER 2022**

On 8th May, 2024 the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs confirmed the above Order under Section 119 Highways Act 1980 (“the Act”) and on 5th September, 2024 Herefordshire Council (“the Council”) certified the above Order under the Act.

The effect of the order, as confirmed, is to divert that part of Public Footpath YP6 in the Parish of Yarpole which commences County Road C1039 at OS Grid Reference SO 4711, 6473 (point A on the order plan) and continues in a generally east-north-easterly direction for approximately 108 metres to OS Grid Reference SO 4720, 6479 (point B on the order plan). The total length of the existing said footpath is approximately 108 metres.

An alternative footpath will be created for use as a replacement, being 2 metres in width, which commences at County Road C1039 at a pedestrian gate at OS Grid Reference SO 4715, 6470 (point C on the order plan) and continues in a generally east-north-easterly direction for approximately 72 metres to OS Grid Reference SO 4721, 6473 (point D on the order plan) where it turns to cross a footbridge over a stream and then continues in a generally northerly direction for approximately 52 metres to OS Grid Reference SO 4720, 6479 (point B on the order plan). The total length of the said proposed new footpath is approximately 124 metres.

A copy of the confirmed order and the order plan have been placed and may be seen free of charge at Blueschool House, Blueschool Street, Hereford, HR1 2AN during normal opening hours. Copies may be purchased on payment of the copying charges of the Council. Copies are also available on the Council’s website at www.herefordshire.gov.uk.

The Council confirms and certifies that all the provisions of the order have been satisfied and therefore the diversion takes effect on the above said confirmation date of this order, but, if any person aggrieved by the order desires to question its validity or that of any provision contained in it on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Act, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act, or any regulation made under it has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the order, he or she may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act, as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 6 to the Act, within 6 weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make an application to the High Court.
