Apologies Paul went through the apologies Meeting and Matters Arising Laura Sirrell mentioned she had a conversation with Briget from Herefordshire, Ludlow and North Shropshire College on how they support neurodiverse students. They want to try and start college visits for school leavers a year earlier.

Laura also noted there are currently no peer support groups for students at Herefordshire, Ludlow and North Shropshire College. Laura noted this is the start of ongoing conversations with the college and Brigid is happy for people to contact her to discuss issues.

Laura was happy to contact the other colleges to find out what support they offer but will liaise with Alexia.

Action 1 - Alexia suggested Laura and herself liaise with each other as to not duplicate work on the transitional support for students from providers. Ladies Night

Katie Eastaugh raised concerns on the small number of participants at these events so far. Exploring the Psychological Contract with Autistic People in Work Nicole Hynek a PhD researcher and associate lecture at Worcestershire University, School of Psychology

Nicole went through the presentation, please see attached for more information. Nicole discussed the experiences, challenges, barriers in the employment of autistic individuals. She discussed the research aims to improve the working relationship between autistic employees and employers using the models of the double empathy problem and psychological contract (relationship and transactional expectations that employees have).

Nicole started the project in 2019 and is approaching the end. The aim of the project is to add value to the everyday lives of autistic people as well as the autism research literature. Three studies form the basis of this project.

- 1. The first study was looking at all the data researchers have on the psychological contract. This study found there was no research working with autistic people and the psychological contract.
- 2. Interview based case study with employees and employers. This research is still ongoing. So far there is a suggestion through this study that meeting the support needs of the autistic employees by line managers and colleagues is the priority.
- 3. Aim to use a psychological contract survey to evaluate whether it accurately captures the experiences of autistic people, with it initially being developed with general population participants 30 years ago.

Nicole helps to then take quantitative data to employers and policy makers on the experiences of autistic adults in employment and the areas that need to be addressed which may lead to higher employment figures and outcomes. Nicole hopes the study will come to a conclusion in April-May 2026 and that data in the research will form a knowledge exchange briefing that will be accessible to those who have been involved in the study including employers, participants and HR advisers. All-Age Joint Autism Strategy Update – Valerie Fitch

Valerie mentioned that she now attends Worcestershire Autism Partnership Board meetings and is hopeful members of the Worcestershire's Board will attend ours in future to give updates on projects that cover both counties. Worcestershire's Autism Partnership Board have now also set up an autism society group of people with lived experience.

Priority 1: Joint Autism Strategy, Improving Understanding and Acceptance - Manny Jhawar-Gill (Head of Service Living Well)

Manny mentioned that the senior commissioning officer post previously held by Glen Crosier is out for advertisement. Laura and Manny are covering this role in the meantime.

Manny seeked clarity on what work Glen had worked on regarding Priority 1 and Priority 7 and how best to feedback updates to the Board. A discussion ensued and Jack clarified that Laura Westwood (Senior Commissioning Manger, Worcester County Council) was the lead for Priority 1: Improving Understanding and Acceptance and that Glen Crosier was previously the lead for Priority 7: Keeping Safe, which since his departure would now rest with Manny until Glen's replacement is appointed.

Action 2 - Valerie proposed that members of this Board could be kept up to date regarding work related to each of the Autism Strategy's priorities via the highlight report that is produced ahead of each of the Autism Strategy Oversight Group meetings. Jack agreed to share these reports from each quarterly meetings with Paul, who will share with Board members. ICS updates & Autism Strategy Jack Caine – Integrated Care Board

Jack discussed how the next Autism Strategy Oversight group meeting is in a few weeks' time. The leads of each priority will be sharing their update report for the end of year one that ends in March. Jack has asked the leads for each priority to send him their updated action plan for year two.

Jack also shared a highlight template on ICS updates, please see attached.

Action 3 - Valerie asked Jack to send an e-Mail to Ugo Johnson for updates on reasonable adjustments and the digital flags projects. Oliver McGowen Mandatory Training – James Baker

James updated the group that the funding for the OMMT is due to run out in September. Although the ICS has stopped funding for the OMMT that the training is available via other private routes. James also mentioned how tier 2 training seems to be better attended than the tier 1 training.

Jack discussed how an updated code of practice would enable the ICS to have better understanding which setting should have tier 1 v tier 2 training. Jack questioned whether all services that work closely with people with a learning disability and autism require tier 2 training as they are maybe quite experienced and knowledgeable already.

A discussion ensued about the take up and impact of the OMMT. Members questioned the value in using the Anna Freud training in some instances over the OMMT, as well as how the impact of the OMMT was being assessed. A number of questions resulted from this discussion and Jack asked Valerie to send them to him for follow up.

Action 4 - Valerie asked Jack to contact Ugo Johnson regarding him coming to a future Board meeting to discuss the impact of the OMMT.

Action 5 – Valerie to send the list of questions to Jack.

Police Hate Crimes reports concerning Autism - Marie Bridgewater (Police Constable, Hate Crime Officer, West Mercia)

Marie sent her apologies. Valerie showed some charts Marie sent to her, showing the number of hate crime volumes had decreased This is partly down to under reporting of hate crimes, specifically involving people with autism. At a recent Police Disability Independent Advisory Group (DIAG) meeting Valerie had highlighted three incidents that had not been marked as such. This is partly

due to victims deciding not to or being unaware they can report an incident as a hate crime, and the police not identifying victims as autistic.

Police are looking at asking questions that will help them identify if someone is autistic.

Valerie is giving training tomorrow (22nd January) to police custody sergeants at Hindlip, Worcestershire regarding identifying autistic individuals and what action should be taken

Valerie also discussed how an autistic individual had been the witness to a hate crime where an individual had been beaten up. The individual has come up with 10 recommendations for how the police can improve the experience of being a witness for those who are autistic. Partner Organisations

1. HANDS CIC (Herefordshire Autism and Neurodiverse Support)

Lucy discussed how in July last year HANDS was set up as a hub to provide a combined space for groups and services providing support for individuals with autism. The hub opened in December and is based at Berrows in Bath Street.

Within this area they have office space for hot desking and meetings. There is also a main area to provide space for groups to host events such as coffee mornings. NAS has brought their library of specialised equipment that they loan to schools or to parents. They are looking to have a room for teenagers and a permanent room for an autism reality experience.

2. Cart Shed

The Cart Shed are continuing their Neurodivergent programme and are running a project on being autistic for adults with ADHD. They are also developing their creative programme. They also have secured funding to continue support sessions for parents of autistic children on the behaviours of an autistic child.

3. Parent Carer Voice (PCV)

Claire discussed coffee mornings that PCV are running every six weeks with colleagues, providers and parent carers to break down barriers helping the providers understand the issues that parent carers are having. Claire then discussed PINS (Partnership for Inclusion in Neurodiversity in Schools). Parent Carer Voice are running the project and have had all of their first meetings within the school system. They are now going to cluster them into groups of four or five schools and find out what the main issues are across those groups. They then will help them develop the skills to help solve these issues.

4. Hereford Make

James mentioned that Hereford Make has nearly used up the money from the Levelling Up Fund. This funding was largely used to help neurodivergent individuals who needed help with blacksmithing technique and the process and theory.

Hereford Make are also looking to do a spoons auction as part of spoons theory.
