HEREFORDSHIRE COUNCIL PUBLIC FOOTPATH MY43 (PART) MADLEY PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER 2025

The above order made on 5th March, 2025 under Section 119 of the Highways Act 1980 will divert that length of Footpath MY43 (Part) in the Parish of Madley which commences at OS Grid Reference SO 4157 3845 (point A on the order plan) and proceeds in a generally north westerly direction for approximately 57 metres to OS Grid Reference SO 4153 3849 (point B on the order plan). The total length of the existing said footpath is approximately 57 metres.

An alternative footpath will be created, being 2 metres in width, which commences at OS Grid Reference SO 4157 3845 and proceeds in a north westerly then generally northerly direction for approximately 55 metres to OS Grid Reference SO 4155 3850 (point C on the order plan) where it turns in a generally south westerly then north westerly direction for approximately 22 metres to OS Grid Reference SO 4153 3849 (point B on the order plan). The total length of the said proposed new footpath is approximately 77 metres.
