This statement is made for the purposes of Section 31(6) of the Highways Act 1980.

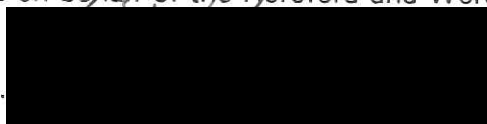

I, JAMES HERVEY-BATHURST DO SOLEMNLY AND SINCERELY DECLARE as follows:-

1. Eastnor Castle Estates Company has been since 16th January 1941 the owner of the land known as Eastnor Castle Estate more particularly delineated on the plan accompanying this declaration and thereon edged red.
2. On the 26th day of June One Thousand Nine Hundred and Ninety-Five, a statement accompanied by a plan delineating the property owned by Eastnor Castle Estates Company by red edging which stated that the ways coloured green on the said plan had been dedicated as footpaths.

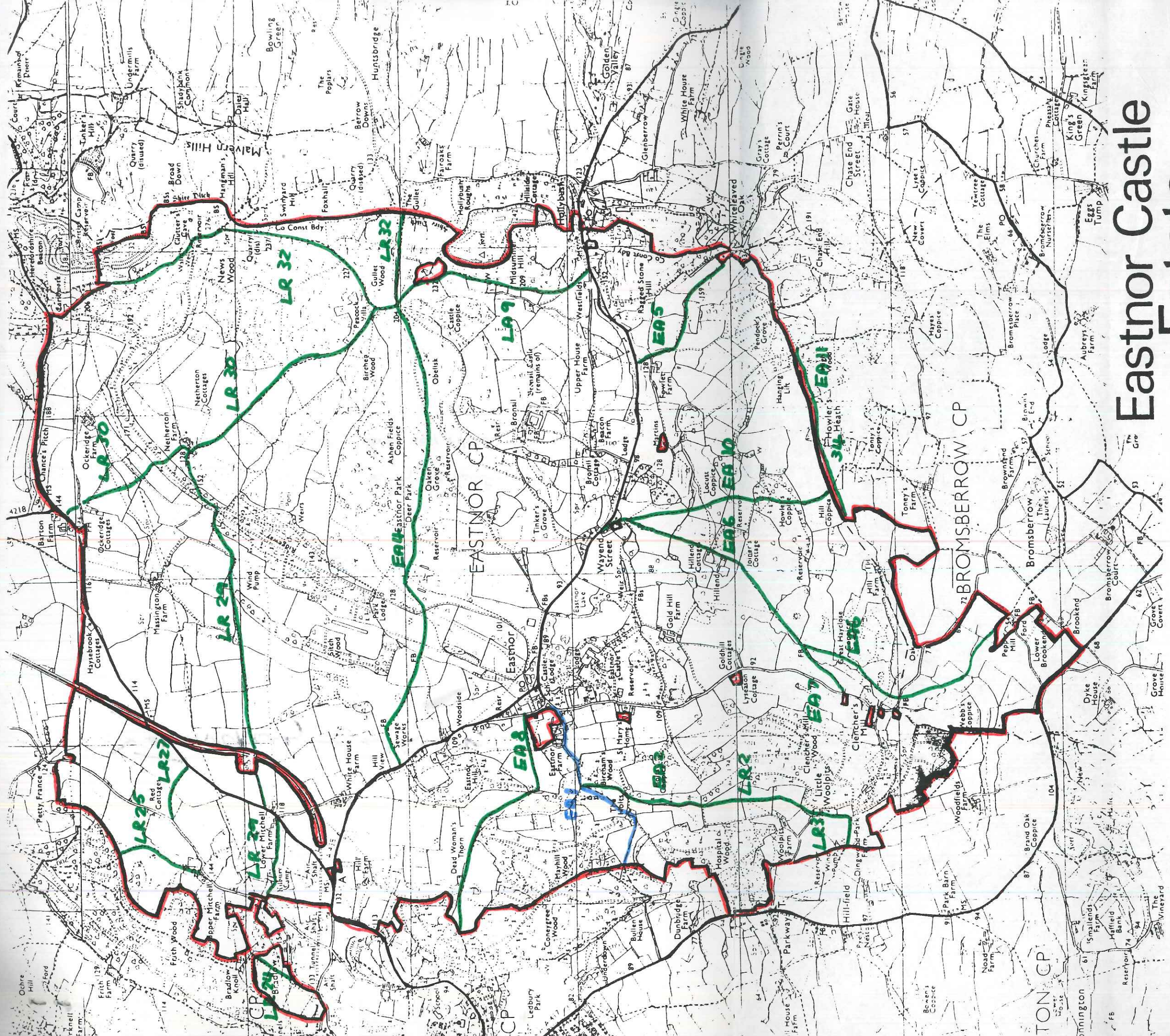
