Inspector's note

When was the WMAWP set up? How often did the WMAWP meet or Herefordshire Council have contact with them during the preparation of the Core Strategy?

Council's response

The West Midlands AWP, formerly known as the West Midlands Regional Aggregates Working Party (WMRAWP) was established in the 1970s. Although the Government has abolished the formal regional structure in England, it has opted to retain Aggregate Working Parties relating to the former 'regions' or clusters.

Between March 2011 and March 2013 there was no DCLG contract to provide Technical Secretarial services to the WMRAWP. During this time, Warwickshire County Council officers voluntarily managed the routine activities of the WMAWP, particularly in respect of data collection. During this time there were no formal WMAWP meetings.

A new contract was awarded in May 2013 by the DCLG to the National Stone Centre for the provision of a Technical Secretariat and the first meeting of the WMAWP in its present form took place in October 2013 with a further meeting in June 2014 and it is anticipated that meetings will be held on a biannual basis. Up until 2011 the WMRAWP had established production targets for the previous Government production guidelines for the period 2001 – 2016 based on historic shares of aggregate production, but had failed to reach agreement concerning the contribution of individual MPAs to the delivery of the revised guidelines for the period 2005 – 2020. At the meeting in June 2014 (see item 5 of the attached AWP minutes) the AWP was able to agree a revised approach which is consistent with that now envisaged in NPPF, which involves using the 10

year sales average as the starting point for calculation the need for additional provision.

The AWP have not made comments on the Herefordshire Core Strategy.

Inspector's note

What input has the WMAWP had in the preparation of the LAA?

Council's response

Once the draft Herefordshire LAA 2013 was completed, it was sent to the WMAWP secretary in January 2014 and comments were sought upon its contents and methodology. Despite requests for comments, nothing was received from the AWP. The Herefordshire LAA was presented to the meeting of the WMAWP in June 2014, along with several other LAAs from member authorities. Members of the WMAWP were given a set time within which to make their comments to the WMAWP secretary (see item 8 of attached minutes of the AWP meeting of June 24th 2014). No comments have been received, even after a reminder email was sent out by the secretary. The AWP was expected to produce a report on the submitted draft LAAs during the Autumn of 2014, however this has been delayed. For this reason, the Herefordshire LAA 2013 remains in draft form and the LAA 2014 is also nearing completion in its draft form.
