On the 17 June 2017 Herefordshire Council decided to make the Little Dewchurch Neighbourhood Plan under 38A(4)(a) of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004. The Little Dewchurch Neighbourhood Plan now forms part of the Development Plan for Herefordshire Council.

Decided:

That the Little Dewchurch Neighbourhood Plan is made and forms part of the Development Plan for Herefordshire.

Reason:

The Neighbourhood Plan meets the basic conditions and is compliant with legal and procedural requirements. Paragraph 38(A)(a) of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 requires that Council to make the Neighbourhood Plan if more than half of these voting in the referendum upon the plan have voted in favour of the plan being used to help decide planning applications in the area. The plan was endorsed by more than the required threshold in the referendum on the 11 May 2017.


